

## 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today we begin a continuous reading of Mark's Gospel that will carry us through this segment of the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. Remember that in Cycle B of the Lectionary, most of the Gospel readings are taken from the Gospel according to Mark.

The Gospel of Mark does not begin with a narrative about Jesus' birth. Instead Mark begins by reporting on the preaching of John the Baptist. John is described as the voice in the wilderness sent to prepare the way of the Lord. Immediately after describing the work of John the Baptist, Mark reports on Jesus' baptism and his temptation in the desert. Jesus' public ministry begins after the arrest of John the Baptist. Mark wants his readers to understand the important connection between the end of the ministry of John the Baptist and the beginning of Jesus' own ministry.

As we learn at the beginning of today's Gospel reading, Jesus preaches the Kingdom of God in continuity with the preaching of John the Baptist. Like John the Baptist, Jesus' pronouncement of the kingdom is a call to repentance. Yet Jesus' preaching is greater than John's. Jesus begins the time of fulfillment; the Kingdom of God is already here. This will be demonstrated again and again, both in Jesus' words and in the actions that follow. Jesus' healings and forgiveness of sins are signs of the Kingdom of God that he announces in his teaching.

In contrast to last week's Gospel, in Mark's Gospel Jesus takes the initiative in calling his first disciples. As mentioned last week, it was more typical of first-century rabbinical schools for students to seek out rabbis, asking to be their disciples. In Mark's Gospel, Jesus breaks with this tradition and invites his disciples to learn from him. Jesus is said to have first called four fishermen—Simon, Andrew, James, and John. Simon and Andrew are brothers. Jesus promises that he will make them "fishers of men." James and John are also brothers. Mark does not report Jesus' words of invitation to them, but he does report that they left their fishing immediately; their father, Zebedee, was left behind in the boat.

Mark's Gospel is told with a great sense of urgency and immediacy. Jesus is a person of action, and events occur in rapid succession. We see this in today's Gospel. Time is of the essence; the fishermen immediately put aside their livelihood to become Jesus' disciples. The Kingdom of God is here and now. The time of fulfillment is at hand. How might our lives be different if we more fully shared this sense of the immediacy of God's kingdom?

## From The Pastor

**Respect for Life** - Tomorrow, January 22, marks the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision legalizing abortion. The Annual March for Life in Washington DC on January 19 proclaimed again that unborn children should be cherished and respected. The Lord became man and was carried in the womb of Mary and thus conveyed that human life is sacred from the moment of conception. Reason alone leads us to conclude that human life begins at conception. It doesn't make sense that the unborn are considered children on day 91 but not on day 90, or on the day they are born, and not on the day before. Conception is the fundamental moment of new human life. May we continue to be tireless in our efforts to promote respect for human life, to cherish the unborn and to do all we can to assure that parents are given the help they need to provide for their children.

**Papal Honors** - Today, January 21 at 4:00pm, 28 local Catholics will receive papal honors at the Cathedral-Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul in Philadelphia. They are a group of lay people, religious and deacons who are being honored by the Pope for exemplary service to the people of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. One of the lay persons that I know is Sheila Longworth, who has been the receptionist at St. Charles Seminary since 1973. She began working when I was in my first year at the Seminary. I got to know her as a student for eight years and then when I served on the faculty at the Seminary for twelve years. She has been a faithful and gracious presence to the students, faculty and visitors at the Seminary. She exemplifies that good qualities of all the recipients. The honors they are receiving leads us to be grateful for all the faithful Catholics, both lay and religious, who love the Lord and serve him faithfully each day by being kind and committed servants to all.

**Martin Luther King Day Service Project** - On Monday Luther King Day, our Parish conducted a Service Project in conjunction with Catholic Social Services and Villanova University. The Project served the needs of some refugees in our area who are being sponsored by Catholic Social Services. Clothing, household items and food were collected in the Parish prior to MLK Day. A representative from Catholic Social Services, some students from Villanova University and some seventh grade students from St. Margaret School gathered with the refugees in the Annex to meet with them and assist them in gathering the items they needed to ease their transition to their new places of residence here. Special thanks to Robert Cermignano, our Coordinator of Parish Services, for organizing and overseeing this Project. Many thanks, too, to all those who contributed items for the refugees.

**Addiction Awareness Series** - Nina Marie Corona will present an Addiction Awareness Series here at St. Margaret's on four Wednesday evenings during Lent. Nina knows the heartache of addiction all too well. After her daughter became dependent on drugs, Nina sought to learn everything she could about addiction. Now she is a certified recovery specialist and doctoral candidate in ministry at Fordham University. "We Thirst: Lessons in Mercy" is a four-part reflection on addiction from a Christian perspective. Each session is designed to focus on a particular aspect of addiction, including the biological, psychological, sociological and spiritual factors of the disease. The program is intended to both educate participants about the complex nature of addiction while inspiring hope in how the addicted can be helped to recover and be spiritually transformed. The sessions will be held in the Antioch Annex on Wednesdays Feb. 21, Feb. 28, March 14, and March 21 at 7pm. The presentations include a mixture of lectures, reflection, music, videos and prayer. Mark you calendars. Attendance is open to all, and the sessions qualify for continuing education credits for social workers and chaplains.

**Christian Unity Week, January 18-25** - Each year the week of January 18-25 is designated by the Church as a time of special prayer for unity among all Christians. At the Last Supper the Lord prayed that all his followers would be one. We join our hearts with the Lord this week as we pray for Christian Unity. ### **SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Wednesday, March 1, 2018 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**
