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

## Fifth Sunday of Lent

Today's Gospel reading is taken from the Gospel of John. We are reading much further into John's Gospel than we have for the past two weeks. Chapter 12 of John's Gospel is a preparation for the beginning of the passion narrative to follow. Jesus has just raised Lazarus from the dead—an important sign in John's Gospel, which inspired many people to believe in Jesus. This event also marks the turning point in Jesus' conflict with the Jewish authorities. John's Gospel tells us that the Sanhedrin met after this event and made plans to kill Jesus. In the 12th chapter of John's Gospel, Jesus is anointed at Bethany and enters Jerusalem in triumph. We again see evidence of the significance of the raising of Lazarus to this event; John reports that the crowds also gathered to see Lazarus.

Following his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, Jesus predicted his suffering, death, and resurrection and prepared his disciples to believe in the salvation that his death would accomplish. Using the metaphor of the grain of wheat, Jesus presented the idea that his dying would be beneficial. He also taught that those who would be his disciples must follow his example of sacrifice. This theme will be repeated in John's account of the Last Supper, when Jesus washed the feet of his disciples as an example of how they must serve one another.

The final section of today's Gospel might be read as John's parallel to the agony in the garden. Unlike the Synoptic Gospels, the Gospel of John does not record Jesus' anguished prayer in the garden of Gethsemane before his arrest. Although comparable words are found in today's reading, Jesus gives a confident response to the question he raises when asking God to save him from his impending death. After announcing his conviction that it is for this purpose that he came, a voice from heaven speaks, as if in answer to Jesus' prayer. This voice, like the one heard at Jesus' baptism and at Jesus' Transfiguration—events reported in the Synoptic Gospels but not in John's Gospel—affirms that God welcomes the sacrifice that Jesus will make on behalf of others. In John's Gospel, Jesus teaches that this voice was sent for the sake of those who would believe in him.

In today's Gospel, we also hear Jesus speak about the cosmic framework against which we are to understand his passion, death, and resurrection. Through his death and resurrection, Jesus conquered Satan, the ruler of this world. In this way the world is judged, but the judgment is not condemnation. Instead, through Jesus' dying and rising, salvation is brought to the world.

# From The Pastor

**Holy Week Schedule** - Holy Week begins next Sunday, March 25. The Masses for next Sunday, Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, will be the regular weekend Schedule. Confessions will be heard on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings, March 27 and 28 from 7:00 - 8:00pm. On Holy Thursday, March 29, there will be no morning Mass, but Morning Prayer will be celebrated at 8:00am. The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated at 7:30 pm. On Good Friday, March 30, we will offer Morning Prayer at 8:00 am. The Liturgy of the Passion of the Lord will be celebrated at 3:00 pm, and at 7:30 pm there will be a Tenebrae (the Latin word for "Darkness") Service, a series of Scripture readings and musical motets on the Lord's Passion. On Holy Saturday, March 31, we will have Morning Prayer at 8:00 am and the Vigil Mass will be at 7:30 pm. The Vigil Mass begins with a Service of the lighting of the Easter Candle, followed by several Scripture readings recounting the history of salvation. Two adults will be baptized, confirmed, and receive their First Communion at the Vigil Mass. Masses on Easter Sunday will be at 7:30, 10:00 and 11:30 am in the Church, and there will also be a 10:00 am Mass in the Annex. Plan on being part of these most solemn and sacred Services of the liturgical year.

**Collection for Rice Bowl** - The second collection next weekend will be for Operation Rice Bowl. 25% of the money collected will be donated to local food banks and feeding programs, and the remainder will go to Catholic Relief Services for feeding the hungry throughout the world.

**Saint Joseph** - Tomorrow, March 19, is the Solemnity of St. Joseph, the Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The selfless love he showed to Mary, his spouse, and Jesus in the Holy Family is a model of Christian virtue. Joseph devoted his life to supporting and loving Jesus and Mary. He did it quietly and humbly. He found his main contentment in protecting and providing for his family. Joseph inspires all of us to be loving and supportive members in our families, to find our contentment in being faithful to the quiet and ordinary ways that God asks us to share our love and assist one another, especially in our families.

**Financial Audit** - The Archdiocese has instituted a regular schedule of auditing parishes so that the parishes can be better assisted and guided in managing their resources. The auditors will be here at St. Margaret's this week on Wednesday and Thursday. We look forward to their help in assuring that we are utilizing our resources well.

**Meeting for Parents of Those Receiving Confirmation in the Fall** - This Meeting will be held on Thursday, March 22 at 7:00 pm in the Annex. Beth Riordan, the Director of Religious Education at St. Elizabeth Parish in Uwchlan, will give the presentation.

**Addiction Awareness Series** - Nina Marie Corona is presenting an Addiction Awareness Series here at St. Margaret's on some Wednesday evenings during Lent. Nina knows the heartache of addiction all too well. After her daughter became dependent on drugs, Nina sought to learn everything she could about addiction. Now she is a certified recovery specialist and doctoral candidate in ministry at Fordham University. "We Thirst: Lessons in Mercy" is a four-part reflection on addiction from a Christian perspective. Each session is designed to focus on a particular aspect of addiction, including the biological, psychological, sociological and spiritual factors of the disease. The program is intended to both educate participants about the complex nature of addiction while inspiring hope in how the addicted can be helped to recover and be spiritually transformed. **The remaining session will be held in the Antioch Annex on Wednesday March 21 at 7pm.** The presentations include a mixture of lectures, reflection, music, videos and prayer. Mark your calendars. Attendance is open to all, and the sessions qualify for continuing education credits for social workers and chaplains.

### COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Wednesday, April 5, 2018 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.

### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months.
