## TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

One of the most powerful scenes in all of American literature is found in Harper Lee's masterpiece "To Kill a Mockingbird." Atticus Finch, the town's respected white lawyer, representing the African American Tom Robinson falsely accused of raping a white woman in the town, makes his closing argument to the jury in a powerful speech, here in part:

*"And so a quiet, respectable, humble Negro who had the unmitigated temerity to 'feel sorry' for a white woman has had to put his word against two white people. I need not remind you of their appearance and conduct on the stand - you saw them for yourselves. The witnesses for the state..have presented themselves to you gentlemen, to this court, in the cynical confidence that their testimony not be doubted, confident that you gentlemen would go along with them on the assumption - the evil assumption - that all Negroes lie, that all Negroes are basically immoral beings, that all Negro men are not to be trusted around our women, on assumption that one associates with minds of their (prejudiced) caliber."*

Unfortunately, the jury ignores Atticus' words. They were tested and failed when they handed in their guilty verdict. Read the book if you note any latent racism in your soul, or tend to prejudice present day immigrants to our country.

There was a day, long ago and far away from us geographically, when Jesus of Nazareth also spoke boldly, and in what we would call a "counter cultural" way, and announced Himself as the "Bread of Life." His hearers, like those jurors, were stunned. Yes, as they themselves had said earlier, "No one has ever spoken like this." But this? This was, as John put it, "a hard saying." Who can accept it?

I don't blame those walk away disciples. For them, this was the strangest linkup of subject and verb they had ever heard. It made no sense. Therefore, it was non-sense. They too were tested, and they failed. But oh! If only they had stayed!

Fortunately, wonderfully, St. Peter and the Eleven did stay. They too had been tested. But St. Peter spoke for them all with a beautiful confession of faith: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." They passed with flying colors. None of them had mighty intellects as far as we know, but they had that openness of mind to take Jesus at His word.

Those most important words of Christ about the Holy Eucharist also form a test of all of us. How does our faith and love of Him hold up, now so long after our baptism?

Once upon a time, a pastor at the local parish was making a wooden trellis to support a climbing vine against a rectory wall. As he was pounding away, he noticed that a little boy was watching him. The youngster didn't say a word, so the pastor kept on working, thinking the lad would leave. But he didn't. Pleased at the thought that his work was being admired, the pastor asked, "Well son, trying to pick up some pointers on gardening?" "No," replied the boy. "I'm just waiting to see what a priest says when he hits this thumb with a hammer.

## From The Pastor

**Grand Jury Report and the Abuse Crisis** - I kept in a file some notes I took on a talk Pope Benedict XVI, who served as Pope from 2005-2013, gave to the Bishops of Ireland. He stated that four principles should be followed in facing the crisis of sexual abuse by the clergy. My notes indicate that the principles he stated were: 1) establish the truth of what happened; 2) take steps to prevent it from happening again; 3) ensure principles of justice are fully respected; 4) bring healing to victims and all those affected by these egregious crimes. In light of the recent report of a Pennsylvania Grand Jury on abuse by clergy in six Pennsylvania Dioceses, I think that these four principles are still good ones in helping us to address the horrors of what happened. As painful as it is, discovering and revealing the truth of what happened is necessary for healing and growth, especially for the victims. We must continue the vigilance that is now taken to prevent abuse. Observing principles of justice for all requires careful discernment and respect for due process in making decisions. And we need to recognize the devastating effect of abuse on the victims and discern how best to help them to heal in a way that is compassionate and just. May the Holy Spirit guide all of us in our thoughts and decisions regarding this issue so that the healing power of God can flow upon the victims and all who have been damaged and affected by these horrible crimes.

**Finance Council Meeting** - The Finance Council met on August 8. The members of the Council are: Msgr. Dougherty, John Braun, Megan Fisher, Patrick Gabor, Lyle Nehls, Martha Ortiz, Cliff Coombs, John Shea, Mark Rooney and Robert Cermignano. Here is a brief summary of some of the items that were considered. 1) We looked over and discussed the final numbers on the operating budget for the fiscal year June, 2017 - June, 2018. In its operating budget, the Parish (includes Church and School), finished \$5,000 in the red. A full report on the operating budget will be distributed for this past fiscal year to the Parish in the Fall. Moving forward our goal is to balance the operating budget and have some reserve to utilize for capital expenses as they arise. 2) The Archdiocese has a new System, Cathonet, which facilitates electronic reporting so the report was submitted to the Archdiocese in that way. 3) Monies that were raised for the Linda Agger Scholarship Fund are being placed in a special account and will be utilized to provide scholarship assistance for Saint Margaret School students. 4) Recent Capital Projects completed were the sealing of the roof of the School and the roof in the back of the Church over the sacristy (total of \$11,200); stripping of wall paper, repair of damaged spots, painting, new carpet and window treatments in the Pastor's rooms in the rectory and new carpet on the outdoor steps of the rectory (about \$13,000). Our own maintenance staff painted the School halls this summer, and provided some new downspouts to the North side of the Church to help address the water intrusion that at times occurs in one part of the Antioch Annex. Also, plans are underway to repair the pointing on part of the North side of the Church to help stop the water intrusion. 5) Plans are underway to put some of our reserve funds in CDs to increase our interest income.

**Catholic Charities Appeal** - The 2018 Appeal continues. A few facts: 1. The CCA helps provide over 400 homeless people with a hot meal seven days a week. 2. Over 900 children in poor and high-crime neighborhoods attend after-school programs daily from the support of CCA. 3. Every day, hundreds of households receive food, rent and utility assistance, clothing, diapers, and parenting support, made possible by CCA donations. As of August 16, 167 families from St. Margaret have donated a total of \$57,700 toward our goal of \$84,835. If you have not already done so, we ask you to support this important Annual Appeal. Donate online at catholiccharitiesappeal.org. Also, brochures and envelopes are available at the doors of the Church.

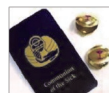

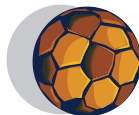

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish.
