PALM SUNDAY

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

It often happens after we have listened to a piece of music that touched us deeply. Or after seeing a noteworthy painting for the first time. Or when we have finished reading a novel that we are sorry to see come to an end. We don't want to speak right away. We just need some uninterrupted time to be quiet and alone with our thoughts.

The formal public reading of the Passion account, which always comes around at Mass on Palm Sunday, is one of those occasions that really needs an aura of respectful silence around it. Somehow or other, when we are finished hearing it, I have always felt that it is not the time or place for a homily. Even the liturgical directives ask that if one is given that it is not to be lengthy. The best follow up is a few moments of precious silence as we try to absorb to the best of our ability the clash of Christ's unfathomable humility and love with the subhuman cruelty of the Roman form of capital punishment. Then there is the behavior of all the various characters. We note fidelity versus fickleness. The public loyalty of the women versus the cowardice of the men.

This year, we hear the Passion as compiled by St. Luke. To that of the other two Synoptic authors (Matthew and Mark) Luke, as a doctor, adds his own details. I imagine them gleaned from careful note taking that he did on what he heard from eyewitnesses, so that his "orderly account" to his dear Theopulis would be as authentic as possible. Luke, remember, gave us shepherds and angels at the first Christmas, and so his account would have some particulars heretofore unrecorded.

I don't make my plea for silence after hearing the Passion just to avoid a "maelstrom on the macadam" on the church parking lot. After all, that can happen on any given Sunday when Mass runs overtime. Nor do I simply want to offset the annual scramble for palm to take home.

No, this story is too powerful to let go of it quickly and move on. In its unique way it is also too personal, because all this ugliness took place because people then and people now, namely you and me, have sinned. We can be so blinded by our own little self-interests; our petty perspective on life that we want to hurry past them. Then we miss all the good things that God does among us despite ourselves. So we have to be still and face the facts.

It turns out that "Were you there when they crucified my Lord?" is not just a rhetorical question. Because in fact we were. Our sins caused it all, those collective and those personal. In that context, it is best for us to be silent, repentant, and trusting that God, as Cardinal Newman powerfully wrote, "is most sure in all His ways." On that all-embracing high note, I close and wish you a spiritually beneficial Holy Week.

From the Pastor

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord – Today we remember in a special way the triumphant entrance of the Lord into Jerusalem and his suffering and death. At every Mass, the suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord is made present. At the beginning of the Eucharistic prayer we sing, “Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord,” just as the people of Jerusalem sang out when the Lord was entering the city, and then we recall the Last Supper, his death and his resurrection. We unite with the Lord in entering the city and in his offering of himself to the Father. Through the power of his grace shared with us at Communion we rise with the Lord to new life. The graces the Lord won for us by his suffering, death and resurrection in Jerusalem are made present to us at every Mass. This Passion Sunday reminds us of what a great gift the Lord is to us. He lovingly gave of himself so that we might share in the new life that only God can provide.

Holy Week Services – This is our most sacred and solemn week of the Church Year. We recall with great devotion the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord, the means by which he so graciously saved us from our sins and shared with us his divine life. Come and participate in our Services. The Mass of the Lord’s Supper, which includes the washing of the feet of 12 parishioners, will be offered on Holy Thursday at 7:30 pm. The Liturgy of the Passion of the Lord will be celebrated on Good Friday at 3:00 pm and the Tenebrae Service will be at 7:30 pm. Tenebrae is a service of reflection on the Lord’s Passion through the use of Scripture readings and sacred music. The Easter Vigil Mass will be celebrated at 7:30 pm on Holy Saturday and the schedule for Easter Sunday will be Masses at 7:30, 10:00 and 11:30 am in Church and an additional Mass at 10:00 am in the Antioch Annex.

Holy Week Confessions – Confessions will be heard on Tuesday evening, April 16, from 7:00 – 8:00 pm. On Saturday, confessions will be heard from 3:30 – 4:45 pm. Receiving the Lord’s forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a powerful way of marking the sacred nature of this Season of Lent, a time to repent and reform our lives, through opening our hearts to the Lord’s forgiveness and renewing grace.

Chrism Mass – At the Last Supper the Lord instituted the sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders. The institution of the Eucharist is solemnly celebrated at the Mass of the Lord’s Supper on Holy Thursday evening. The Institution of Holy Orders is celebrated at the Chrism Mass at 10:00 am on Holy Thursday morning at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul. The priests of the Archdiocese gather to renew their priestly promises and celebrate with the people of God the gift of the priesthood. At this Mass the sacred oils for Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders, and the Anointing of the Sick are consecrated. Please pray for me and for all priests on Holy Thursday that we might be ardent servants of the Lord and faithfully live the blessed calling we have received.

Church Teaching - Holy Orders is the sacrament through which the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the Church until the end of time; thus it is the sacrament of apostolic ministry. It includes three degrees: episcopate, presbyterate, and diaconate...The divinely instituted ecclesiastical ministry is exercised in different degrees by those who even from ancient times have been called bishops, priests, and deacons. Catholic doctrine, expressed in the liturgy, the Magisterium, and the constant practice of the Church, recognizes that there are two degrees of ministerial participation in the priesthood of Christ: the episcopacy and the presbyterate. The diaconate is intended to help and serve them. For this reason the term sacerdos in current usage denotes bishops and priest but not deacons. Yet Catholic doctrine teaches that the degrees of priestly participation (episcopate and presbyterate) and the degree of service (diaconate) are all three conferred by a sacramental act called “ordination,” that is, by the sacrament of Holy Orders.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE FOR LENT

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, March 6, 2019, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

All are encouraged to participate in Operation Rice Bowl which has aided countless hungry persons here in the Archdiocese as well as throughout our nation and our world.

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Thursday, April 25, 2019 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months.
