

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

One of the many quiet joys the priesthood has brought me is the access to people's lives given to me out of their innate trust and love. In particular, I have had the privilege of watching sons and daughters in families grow, mature, marry and have children of their own. Recently I was in the company of a faith-filled couple I first met as college students when I was their chaplain. Now they are married long enough to have college age sons of their own. Sons I had baptized as babies. I happened to ask them about the boys' personalities. Sure enough, I learned that they were strikingly different from each other. One was very self-assured, to the point of not ever letting an obstacle such as human error on a curriculum card stand. He would be the one to tell his counselor "You've got to do something to get this fixed." The other son, while also comfortable with himself, nevertheless would not fight to correct such a happenstance, but would consider it a "done deal" and then rely on his friends for advice and support.

All this by way of expressing my thoughts when I pondered over this weekend's Mass Readings. In the Gospel especially, we see two of the Apostles a bit bewildered over the sayings of their Master. Thomas, ever ready to transparently tell anyone who would listen of his doubts or his struggles with the truth. So He looks Jesus in the eye and frankly states that he does not know where Jesus is going, so how can he or they (or we) possibly know the way? In so doing, Thomas again brings forth from Jesus words to build a life upon: "I am the Way and the Truth and the Life."

Presuming that Philip, a mild-mannered man just trying to figure out his new life and what it all meant, happened to overhear especially that last part of Jesus' answer. So he innocently pipes up with a humble request: "Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us." I can hear a hint of exasperation in Jesus' voice moderated by His patience when He replies with a question: "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip?" Then the theological bomb: "Whoever has seen Me has seen the Father." That remark alone would test the mettle of theologians for centuries.

Now please note something about Jesus in His dealings with these two of His chosen Twelve. It is *His patience*. Would you not agree that that is one of the most neglected virtues of our time? Our fast-paced culture, which seeks out tranquilizers and escape from reality drugs, testifies that patience needs practice. We have all felt the need during the present health and economic crisis called "corona." The virtue of patience "oils the gears" of our interactions.

As always, Jesus gives the example because He lives it. Depending on our personalities, which we know right well can be as diverse as colors in the rainbow, imitation of Jesus in this way can vary in difficulty. But we have to try it out more than we sometimes do for one simple reason: God is so patient with us.

From the Pastor

The Blessed Mother and our Mothers – The Blessed Mother had the singular privilege of giving birth to our Savior, Jesus Christ. Mary, through her faith and obedience to the will of God, brought Christ into the world. Every mother shares in that sublime role of the Blessed Mother by giving birth to a child God made in God’s image and likeness. Every mother helps to bring Christ into our world by having a child and then nurturing that child with kindness and faithful love so that the life of Christ grows within the child. The life of Christ that we receive at baptism needs to be nurtured, and mothers play a crucial role in helping that life of Christ to flourish within their children. On this Mother’s Day, we express our gratitude for the many ways our mothers share with us the goodness of God and foster our spiritual growth in Christ. There is no greater work or honor than to bring Christ to our world and mothers do that in a very wonderful way by seeing and nurturing the life of Christ in their children. May God bless our mothers for sharing in the mission of Our Blessed Mother. May Mary watch over all our mothers and fill them with God’s wisdom, joy, patience and peace.

The Simple Joys – These days of quarantine quiet and stay at home days and nights have something of the same feel for me as I had when I made a thirty-day retreat back in 1998. There were some orientation, break, and concluding days, so the retreat actually lasted thirty-six days. I made it at a retreat house in Northern Jersey. Six of us were on the retreat and we had to maintain silence, except for an occasional break day, on which we could briefly speak to each other, but we were not permitted any contact with others, or even to read the newspaper. It took a little time to get used to the complete silence and the feeling of isolation, but what I began to notice in me was a new appreciation for the simple joys of life. I began to appreciate more and savor the meals and to enjoy nature in a new way on walks outside. It slowed me down so that I felt God’s loving presence more in the simple gifts of everyday life: food, shelter, and nature. I also came to value more the gift of the Eucharist which we celebrated every day and came to appreciate more my family and friends as I was apart from them for those days. I was glad when the days drew to a close and I had the opportunity to reconnect with the people in my life, but I left with an appreciation for how the days had helped me to realize that life is best lived not by rushing through it, but by savoring the loving presence of God in the many people and in the many ordinary ways he is with us each day.

Coronavirus and Parish Finances – I want to express my gratitude to all of you for your continued generosity to the Parish during the pandemic. I was fearful that our income would drop dramatically since we were not gathering for public Masses. As I mentioned before, our income in March was down about \$11,000 from last year, but in April we actually ended up with a higher income than last year. In April, our Easter collection is \$2,000 more than last year and our regular Sunday collections were up another \$10,000 over last year. So between March and April we are \$1,000 ahead of last year. I am amazed by that, and I thank you all for your generous response in donating to the Church by mailing in or dropping off your envelopes, or giving online. May God bless you for your continued support of our Parish.

Church Teaching: Adoration – To adore God is to acknowledge, in respect and absolute submission, the “nothingness of the creature” who would not exist but for God. To adore God is to praise and exalt him and to humble oneself, as Mary did in the Magnificat, confessing with gratitude that he has done great things and holy is his name. The worship of the one God sets man free from turning in on himself, from the slavery of sin and the idolatry of the world. (from the Catechism of the Catholic Church)

She goes to help; she doesn’t go to boast and tell her cousin, “Listen, I’m in charge now, because I am the Mother of God!” No, she did not do that. She went to help! 

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Thursday, May 28, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. Engaged couples preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage can register, explore possible dates or find out more information for pre-marriage classes by visiting **PhilaMarriagePrep.com**. REGISTRATION

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for reception of the Sacraments and letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Please call the rectory for an appointment if you need a certificate.






