

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

I never thought of myself this way, but soon after my beloved Dad followed my Mom to heaven about a year later, someone of my acquaintance remarked: "Now you are an orphan." Technically speaking the person was correct, but to hear the word said brought on a sense of lonesomeness I had not foreseen. I had just chalked Dad's passing at the time as one of those inevitable passages in life. After all, Mom and Dad had been blest to reach their nineties. Their departure for heaven was in one sense timely. All this is not to deny that I miss them both. Nearly twenty years later their absence created holes in my heart that at certain times brings out a tear or two.

These thoughts surfaced as I read the tender statement of Our Lord to His disciples as He tried to prepare them for His death. "I will not leave you orphans," said He to them. "I will come to you. In a little while the world will no longer see Me, but you will see Me, because I live and you will live." You have to pause here to remember that Jesus was addressing grown men, some of whose parents may have already passed on. Regardless, you cannot listen to Jesus here and not be touched by His tender outreach, and by extension, to us. It is the same touch we try to offer indirectly to the families and friends who have lost loved ones due to this terrifying virus pandemic.

We can sometimes overlook this appealing quality of tenderness in Our Lord. The world around us endorses a kind of "stiff upper lip" at these times. Not so with the wonderful Person we join the Apostles in calling our "Master." That virus death toll on our TV screens glosses over the pain each number causes.

All of this brings us right back to the empty tomb we so heartily celebrated some five weeks ago. I know it feels like another time indeed this year. The fact is that Jesus has been raised by His Father. He who once was dead dies no more. And more than that, the wonder of the resurrection puts a stamp of the Father's approval on all that He said and did while He walked among us on earth. We could say that the Father did not leave His Son an orphan. Nor does He abandon us, even in this terrible time.

I think all of us will remember this past Lent like no other because of COVID-19. Many spiritual lessons have emerged, and will continue to do so as a result of this situation. One of them has to be that God truly has not left us orphans, and He never will. But we have to remember that now more than ever. "I am with you always" said He. What is your response?

From the Pastor

Livestream of Liturgy to Honor Mary - In lieu of our Annual May Procession, we will have a private service to honor Our Blessed Mother on Tuesday evening, May 19 at 7:00 PM. I invite you to participate by way of livestream so that we can implore Mary's intercession, and celebrate her motherly care for us and allow her to draw us close to Jesus our Savior.

Email Scams Sent in my Name – It has been brought to my attention by several people that emails are being sent that are purported to be from me requesting help and assistance. The emails do not come from my email address and are scams. Do not respond to them. If you think the email might be an authentic request from me, you can check with me by my parish email or by phone.

Cabinets for the Relics – Fr. Chapman, the former pastor of St. Margaret's, had an uncle who was a priest and he collected a sizeable amount of authentic relics of saints. He left his collection to Fr. Chapman and when he retired in 2014, he graciously left the relics with us here at St. Margaret's. We have kept them in cabinets in the Annex, but some months ago we decided to commission a carpenter to build two cabinets to be placed in the alcove where the St. Therese statue stands so that we could display the relics in our Church. The cabinets were delivered last week. The carpenter did a beautiful job. I am grateful to my parents for making a donation that covered the cost of the cabinets. The cabinets are worthy pieces for housing such a sacred trove and he designed them to fit beautifully in the space of the alcove. This space stands as a place in Church that reminds us of the holiness of the saints and their loving intercession for us. May St. Therese and all the saints whose relics will be in the cabinets be catalysts for us to seek holiness, and give us the comfort of the great circle of holy friends, examples, and intercessors we have in the saints.

Obligation Dispensed for Ascension Thursday – Ascension Thursday is normally a holyday of obligation, but you are dispensed from the obligation this year because of the pandemic. We will be livestreaming Mass that day so I encourage you to participate virtually to celebrate this great solemnity of the Lord's Ascension by which he lifted up all of humanity and showed us our ultimate goal of sharing in his heavenly glory.

Pennsylvania's Plans for Various Phases in the COVID-19 Situation - Governor Wolf has defined three phases that will determine the amount of restrictions necessary to combat the spread of the coronavirus. The three phases have been labeled red, yellow and green. Progressively lower levels of people infected with the virus have been set to establish moving from one phase to another. Our portion of the state is currently still in the red phase. In our Archdiocese, the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holydays has been suspended and public Masses are not permitted. All Masses are celebrated privately. Private liturgies for Funerals, Weddings, and Baptisms are permitted, but there can be no more than 10 people at these gatherings. Church is permitted to be open for private prayer and the Sacrament of Reconciliation can be scheduled and celebrated. When the situation will get to the point when the government will determine that our area can move into the yellow phase is still not certain. Guidelines for gatherings, such as Church Services, in that phase are not yet fully determined. Archbishop Perez will provide the necessary guidance when the yellow and green phases arrive.

The Independent Reconciliation and Reparations Program (IRRP) of the Archdiocese – Recently the Archdiocese issued a report on the status of the IRRP and asked that the information be shared with the people of the Archdiocese. In November of 2018, the Archdiocese of Philadelphia established the IRRP to provide some healing and help for survivors of clergy sexual abuse. Individuals had until a certain date to file claims with the Program, which was managed by independent administrators. Formal claims were filed by 615 people. As of April 22, 2020, \$43.8 million of total compensation had already been paid to resolve 208 claims fully. The Archdiocese estimates that the total cost of the IRRP will be approximately \$130 million. The Archdiocese stated: "To fund the remaining IRRP obligations, we pursued the sale of certain Archdiocesan assets, borrowing, and risk mitigation payments from related ecclesiastical entities. This course of action is providing approximately \$33.2 million from the sale or lease of non-restricted assets; \$28 million in risk mitigation payments; and \$25 million derived from loans." Archbishop Perez exhorted all the faithful to join together in a common effort to help support survivors and gave his reassurance that "the Archdiocese has a zero tolerance policy for clergy, lay employees, and volunteers who engage in misconduct or abuse of children and takes immediate action when an accusation is made." He promised that the Archdiocese will remain steadfast in respecting "the dignity of each person as a precious child of God."

Fortieth Anniversary – Today is the Fortieth Anniversary of my ordination to the Priesthood. I offer thanks to God for the gift of my vocation and for the many kindnesses and the abundant patience extended to me by the people I have been privileged to shepherd over the years. I am grateful to all of you, the people of St. Margaret's, for your support and goodness to me over the past six years. You have made them very happy ones for me and I am honored to serve as your pastor.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Thursday, May 28, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. Engaged couples preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage can register, explore possible dates or find out more information for pre-marriage classes by visiting **PhilaMarriagePrep.com**. REGISTRATION

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for reception of the Sacraments and letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Please call the rectory for an appointment if you need a certificate.




