Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Ronald Wayne would draw personal meaning from today's parable. Who is he? Ronald Wayne is the little-known third Apple founder who sold his 10% stake for \$800. Apple shares hit an historic \$1 trillion market cap value last August. Owning 10% of Apple right now sounds like a dream. But Mr. Wayne knows what it's like to watch that opportunity slip away.

Wayne joined Apple co-founders Steve Wozniak and Steve Jobs, who were 21 and 25 at the time, to provide the new company with so-called "adult supervision" and to oversee mechanical engineering and documentation in exchange for a 10% stake in the business.

While both Jobs and Wozniak were young and broke, Wayne had assets, including a house, and feared that the financial burden would fall on him if the deal ever went south. So after spending a mere 12 days with Wozniak and Jobs, Wayne had his name taken off the contract and sold his shares back to the co-founders. Today a 10% stake in Apple would be worth \$95 billion. It would make Wayne one of the richest people in the world. Google the rest of his story and discover what he thinks of his decision.

If He were preaching in person today, I believe Jesus would have used this story of Mr. Wayne in a retelling of His original parable. We read there about the three reactions that the servants had to the gifts given them by the "man going on a journey." How we pity servant number 3 for his foolish choice. Talk about the need in life to balance prudence with wisdom! But the parable also stresses the importance of using one's gifts and talents to serve others, especially the poor.

This Sunday just happens to be World Day of the Poor in our Church calendar. It is the fourth one of these "Days" having been established by Pope Francis in 2017. Here are some of the thoughts in Pope Francis' inaugural Message given at that time and still relevant:

"Over these 2,000 years, how many pages of history have been written by Christians who, in utter simplicity and humility, and with generous and creative charity, have served their poorest brothers and sisters. The most outstanding example is that of Francis of Assisi...He was not satisfied to embrace lepers and give them alms, but chose to go to Gubbio to stay with them.

We may think of the poor simply as the beneficiaries of our occasional volunteer work, or impromptu acts of generosity that appease our conscience. However good and useful such acts may be for making us sensitive to people's needs...they ought to lead to a true encounter with the poor and a sharing that becomes a way of life.

...The Body of Christ, broken in the Sacred Liturgy, can be seen, through charity and sharing, in the faces and persons of the most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters.

...Saint John Chrysostom's admonition remains ever timely: 'If you want to honor the body of Christ, do not scorn it when we see it is naked; do not honor the Eucharistic Christ with silk vestments, and then, leaving the church, neglect the other Christ suffering from cold and nakedness.'"

From the Pastor

Seminary Appeal – The Annual Seminary Appeal is underway. Kenneth Omeke, a seminarian who is serving here at St. Margaret’s on Thursdays and is blessing us by making St. Margaret’s his home parish, will speak at all the Masses this weekend. Forty Hours Devotions – Plan to join us for our Annual Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotions on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, November 22-24. Father Sean Loomis who serves as the chaplain for the Deaf Apostolate in the Archdiocese and also as a parochial vicar at Annunciation BVM Church in Havertown, will be our preacher. Evening Prayer with a homily by Father Loomis will be celebrated each evening at 7:00 pm. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed in Church each of the three days from after the last Mass in the morning until the 7:00 pm Evening Prayer Service. Spend some quiet time in prayer those days as we renew our love and devotion to the Lord in the Eucharist. Forty is a number used in the Scriptures to indicate a significant time for intensifying our relationship with the Lord. Jesus spent forty days in the desert to prepare for his public ministry by communing with God the Father and resisting temptation, and the Israelites spent forty years in the desert preparing to enter the Promised Land. Jesus spent forty hours in the tomb before his resurrection to new life. Our Parish Forty Hours Devotions is meant to deepen our relationship with the Lord by contemplating his presence in the Eucharist. There is no better way for us to commune more deeply with the Lord than through the gift of His Body and Blood.

Church Teaching: The Church Building as the Place for the Liturgical Assembly Gathered as One Body in Christ

– The Church building is a sign and reminder of the immanence and transcendence of God – who chose to dwell among us and whose presence cannot be contained or limited to any single place. Worship is the loving response of God’s people to the mystery of God who is with us and is yet to come. As visible constructions, churches are signs of the pilgrim church on earth; they are images that proclaim the heavenly Jerusalem, places in which are actualized the mystery of the communion between God and man. In addition, the church building manifests the baptismal unity of all who gather for the celebration of liturgy and conveys the image of the gathered assembly. While various places express a hierarchical arrangement and the diversity of functions, those places should at the same time form a deep and organic unity, clearly expressive of the unity of the entire holy people.

Spiritual Thought – It is most important that the Holy Eucharist becomes life’s focal point: that the Eucharistic Savior is the center of existence; that every day is received from His hand and laid back therein. (St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, Edith Stein)

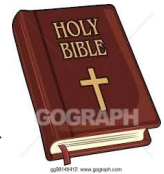

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Thursday, November 19, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. Engaged couples preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage can register, explore possible dates or find out more information for pre-marriage classes by visiting **PhilaMarriagePrep.com**. REGISTRATION

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for reception of the Sacraments and letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Please call the rectory for an appointment if you need a certificate.
