Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Kings are more than cards in a deck or pieces on a chessboard. We know them as the linchpins for many an historical account and their lives intersect with those of many revered saints. As time passed, they gradually changed from being staunch persecutors of Christianity to royal purveyors of it.

While we proudly live in a democratic republic, many of us remain fascinated by anyone who wears the crown in other nations. Here at home, the title can denote a chief company executive or a country's heroic founder; a master spirit, or an otherwise noteworthy person, at least of superior importance.

Recall when Pontius Pilate asked Jesus, amid the tension of their Good Friday encounter, whether or not He was a king. Jesus answered with another question: "Is this your opinion or have others told you of Me?" This followed by a reassurance to the nervous procurator: "My kingdom is not here."


So we know He is a king by His own strong admission. As we believe Jesus unconditionally, it is easy for us to add to today's feast its complete title for Christ, namely "King of the Universe." A corollary of that last has to be that His coming judgment of us all on the Last Day is momentous. We should be keenly aware of how to get ready.

Like so many aspects of our relationship with God, that readiness is simple: habitual practice of good deeds done to our neighbor. And this presumably from a pure and loving heart. That's it. No need to make readiness more complex. Look no further.

As we gather this week around the family table for our annual American Thanksgiving Day, there are myriad reasons to think and thank before we eat. One of the major ones is to remind ourselves that Jesus our Lord, our King, is loyal to, and loving of us, His sisters and brothers. All He asks is our return of the favor.

Gilbert Keith Chesterton, the great British writer, philosopher and lay theologian once wrote this: "I would maintain that thanks are the highest form of thought; and that gratitude is happiness doubled by wonder."

God love you and give you His peace!

Rejoice in Hope; Endure in Affliction; Persevere in Prayer

From the Pastor

Reminder Regarding the Reception of Communion – I remind everyone that Communion should be consumed immediately after receiving it and before you proceed back to your seat. We should not carry the Body of Christ back to the pew to consume it there.

Covid-19 Resurgence – As the cases of Covid-19 have risen in our nation, I am grateful that we have not had any Covid-19 cases stemming from our Masses or Parish activities. I thank you for observing the protocols we have in place and ask that you continue to observe them so that we can continue to be a safe environment here at St. Margaret Church.

Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe – This is the last Sunday of the Church Year. It is fitting that the culmination of the Church Year is to celebrate the Kingship of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus came to usher in a new kingdom, one of love, justice, joy and peace. We participate in that kingdom by confessing that Jesus is Our Lord and King, the center of our lives and the source of salvation, truth and peace. All that we have celebrated this Church Year, from the birth of Our Lord to his resurrection from the dead, ascension into heaven, and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon us, is meant to lead us to surrender our lives to the Lord our King and open our hearts to the gifts of his grace and goodness. Jesus is the King of the Universe. He rules with love and mercy and wants to share his love and life with us. We bow before the Lord with humble hearts, pledging our allegiance to him, and seeking to follow him always, for his is the path to the fullness of life.

Forty Hours Devotions – Our Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotions begin today, Sunday, November 22, and end on Tuesday evening, November 24. Father Sean Loomis, the parochial vicar at Annunciation BVM Church in Havertown and the priest chaplain for the deaf apostolate in the Archdiocese, will be preaching at the Evening Prayer Devotion at 7:00 pm on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed in Church from after the last Mass each morning until Evening Prayer at 7:00 pm each evening. Come and pray before the Lord. You can sign up for a 30 minute time slot on the sheets in the vestibule of the Church. We would like at least two people to be praying in Church before the Blessed Sacrament at any given time. It is fitting that our Forty Hours Devotions come at the end of the Church Year. The Eucharist is the greatest gift the Lord has given us, the gift of himself, his own Body and Blood. As we close out the Church Year and prepare for a new one, we worship the Lord and renew our love for the Eucharist.

Thanksgiving – Thursday, November 26, is the national holiday of Thanksgiving. Mass will be celebrated that day at 9:00 am. Come and join us as we lift up our hearts to God in thanksgiving for his many blessings and ask that he watch over and bless our families, our Parish and our nation. A collection will be taken up during the Mass to support the Interfaith Hospitality Network, which serves the needs of the homeless in our area.

Consecration to the Holy Family – Next Sunday, the First Sunday of Advent, is the beginning of a new Church Year. The Knight of Columbus have requested that we consecrate our families to the Holy Family again this year, as we did on this Sunday last year. We will distribute the family consecration cards as you enter Mass, and we will offer the consecration prayer together after the petitions of the Universal Prayer. The family is the most important unit of the Church and society, and the place where faith in Christ and the love of God are best communicated. It is our hope that this consecration will root our families more deeply in the love and faith of the Holy Family.

Parish Theme for this Year: “Rejoice in hope; endure in affliction; persevere in prayer.” – The continued challenges of Covid-19 can be discouraging. But we cannot give in to discouragement. What can keep our hope alive is prayer. Prayer connects us to God and opens our hearts to receive his strength and life. Prayer reminds us that God is love and God is with us. Our souls are refreshed by God’s presence and discouragement gives way to hope.

Church Teaching: Forty Hours Devotions and Exposition of the Holy Eucharist – For several centuries, the traditional Forty Hours Devotion has been celebrated in parishes as a time of annual renewal and prayer. It originated in the early part of the sixteenth century at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Milan, Italy, probably as a commemoration of the forty hours that Christ’s body lay in the tomb between his death and resurrection...The solemn exposition of the holy eucharist offers the opportunity to the people of God for prayerful reflection on their call to a deeper devotion to the holy eucharist and a more faithful living of the Christian life. It provides them with an opportunity to become more aware of Christ’s presence with his people and invites them to a spiritual communion with him. (from the Introduction to the Order for the Solemn Exposition of the Holy Eucharist)

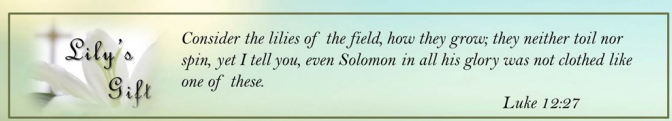
Scouting for Food No Contact Food Drive

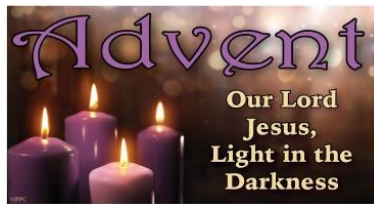

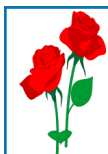

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Thursday, December 17, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. Engaged couples preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage can register, explore possible dates or find out more information for pre-marriage classes by visiting **PhilaMarriagePrep.com**. REGISTRATION

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for reception of the Sacraments and letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Please call the rectory for an appointment if you need a certificate.
