

## TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Most food shoppers know that trips to the supermarket are never a matter of “grab ‘n go.” Having joined their ranks in my retirement, with doctors and would-be nutritionists ever ready with advice, I know you have to read the labels carefully and consider weights and measures (pardon me) as “weighty matters.” So I must check the calorie count. And ask the label to tell me all about salt and sugar content. “Is there enough protein in it, I ask myself, “to merit a short descent from shelf to cart”? All this compels me to offer a much-delayed salute to my Mom and every rectory cook I have known for what they went through at the supermarket.

But when it comes to the matter of that most special food and drink that comes the fore in the gospels, we enter a different realm entirely, where such checking is out of place. You as a believer know why. It’s because of both the divine purveyor and the food itself: Christ Jesus our Lord. He is the content. There is no equal to the excellence of this “product”.

The “Bread of Life” theme dominates St. John’s sixth chapter, and we have for several Sundays so far received a “summertime refresher course” on just what it is we believe and how we should appreciate the gift of the Eucharist as we bring our sunnanned selves to the altar.

We begin with the fact that the Eucharist, as a sacrament, is nothing less than a gift from God meant to express His love and His desire to be part of our lives on earth. Later, God willing, in heaven, we won’t need it because we will be a part of God’s life more directly and joined with Him in bliss.

Meanwhile, here on earth it’s a daily challenge to let God live in us. It’s all a matter of trial and error, with evil always stalking our moments of joy and shortening them. Sometimes we just can’t smile. Sin caused all that, yours and mine, all the way back to that disappointing duo that just couldn’t keep their hands off a certain forbidden tree.

What we believe is starkly simple but far from ordinary. What we believe is that on the first Holy Thursday, surrounded by a mere eleven close friends, the real Jesus took simple unleavened bread and a cup of ordinary wine and identified Himself with it.

Note here, for the sake of combatting several misinterpretations that other Christian bodies make, Jesus did not say that this was a symbol of Himself. No, this really is His Body and Blood, His real presence under the appearances of bread and wine. As mysterious as what Jesus does through His priests really is, I can only wonder how others can’t take the simple words “body and blood” at face value. The sad fact is that many Catholics these days are yielding to the same misinterpretation.

Meanwhile, we believe in what Jesus said and did and still does for us. It’s the safest food out there, with no human intervention or alteration, and if it’s not part of our weekly diet we are spiritually malnourished. The good news is that this greatest meal ever made is here presented by the greatest Host of all. So come to the feast every week. Jesus believes you are worthy of His invitation. Stop by the supermarket later.

## From The Pastor

**The Gospel and Music** - For vacation this year I took a bus tour to Nashville and Memphis, Tennessee. Both cities are known for their music: Memphis for the blues, soul and the rock and roll of Elvis Presley; and Nashville for country music. Hearing the history of the music of both cities, it struck me that all of the music was profoundly influenced by gospel music. The inspirational words of the Scriptures inspired great spiritual and gospel music that influenced the development of blues, soul, country and the rock and roll of Elvis. At Church we sometimes sing the hymn "How Can I Keep From Singing." The words of that hymn convey that the faith we have in the love and presence of God in our lives inspires us to sing and be filled with joy. We hear the "music" of God's love and it flows into our hearts, actions, and voices. Just as many aspects of music were influenced by the gospels, our lives too should be inspired by God's Word. Perhaps we have heard it so often now that we do not let our hearts be as touched and inspired as the Lord desires. May we allow ourselves to hear anew the "music" of God's word and be inspired to live in his love and gladly share it in our world.

**Collection for Missions next Weekend, August 26/27** - A sister from the missionary Institute of the Servants of the Lord and the Virgin Matara will speak at all the Masses this weekend as part of the Annual Summer Mission Cooperative Appeal conducted in our Archdiocese. The Institute began in 1988 in San Rafael, Argentina and has grown to over 1,200 sisters on mission in almost 40 countries. They strive to go where the presence of religious sisters is most needed. Their missions include schools, homes of mercy, medical care, pro-life apostolates, and parish work. They are an international community but have been blessed with many vocations from the United States, a little over 100 at present. The collection for the support of this Institute will be taken up as a second collection at all the Masses next weekend, August 26-27.

**St. Rose of Lima** - My great aunt was an IHM sister who served for 20 years in Peru, mostly in Lima. I also have several family members named Rosemary, so I feel something of a connection with St. Rose of Lima, whose feast day is on August 23. St. Rose died in 1617, at the age of 31. Her parents refused to let her enter a convent, so she mainly lived a life of solitude at home, working in the garden and sewing to help support her parents, who had come upon hard financial times. She spent many hours in prayer and practiced penance, as well as opening up a room in her house where she cared for homeless children, the elderly and the sick. Although she faced opposition at times, stayed mostly at home and died at a young age, St. Rose lived a holy life and had a profound impact on many people. The example of her life helps us to see that there are many ways we can serve God in the solitude of our own homes. Holiness does not require doing great things, but doing faithfully what God asks us to do, especially the daily hidden works, the acts of patience, love and commitment that are not seen by the public. We pray that St. Rose will intercede for us and inspire us to lovingly serving the Lord by fidelity to the many quiet and generally unseen acts of devotion that he asks of us in our homes and at our work.

**Seminarian** - Jamey Moses, the seminarian who interned at the Parish this summer completed his summer assignment here on August 5. Jamey was very pleased to be here and commented often to me how he felt so welcomed by the parishioners. He will be coming back to us on Thursdays during the school year as part of his pastoral education program in preparation for the priesthood.



### COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. ### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE
