## THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

If you stroll through a bookstore, or scroll through a book list, you will inevitably find a long list of what are called “self-improvement” books. Google alone provides a list of six types. There are books for self-confidence, self-help, self-love, self-growth, self-improvement and self-esteem. I have to conclude from this variety of offerings that a lot of people are walking around with deep concern over their perceived failure, or at least worrisome weakness in the matter of living life fully.

Of course, for me as a believer in God the Father, Jesus Christ His only Son, and the Holy Spirit, I need only turn to the Bible for the answers to all those areas of concern. I can declare with the utmost confidence because I believe that the co-author of Holy Scripture is God, who has chosen to work through the human writers. I also hold that the discernment of the Church, guided by the Holy Spirit, is the deciding factor as to which books belong in the collection.

One doesn't have to go very deeply into the teachings of Christ until we learn the mind-blowing truth about God. One that we would never conclude on our own: that our one God is a community of three Persons. These same three are distinct but equal and Jesus names them “the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.”

There is no sense trying to comprehend this truth in its fullness because that is beyond the ability of our finite minds. After all, God by nature is the Supreme Being, the absolute “Other” from us. A much more spiritually profitable exercise is to tackle the question of why Jesus told us this in the first place. As with so much of what He taught us about God and prayer, the answer lies in His love for us.

All of us at one time or another in our lives have loved someone. Leaving family aside as automatic, just turn to friends. Initially they know very little about us. But in pursuing the relationship, we want them to know us inside and out as time goes by. We in effect say to them: “This is who I am.” Jesus tells us the same thing, despite His knowing from the outset that we will never fully know the Infinite One.

Putting all this into the context of the current cultural buzzword, God wants to be “transparent.” He wants us to know the kind of God with whom we are relating. This Trinity is what God is. It follows that we can benefit so much from an authentic and deep relationship with Him based on mutual love.

So we celebrate, venerate and advocate for this revealed mystery on this solemn feast day. Fuller speculation about what the Trinity means is the task primarily of theologians. For the rest of us, the main point Jesus wanted to make is that God's love for us is so deep and rich that we don't need to turn to any self-help library. We realize from the truth of the divine Trinity what God really wants to be for us: Someone we can love and know. Or, to put into other words, He wants us to know Him like an open book.

## **From the Pastor**

**Gratitude to Mr. Robert Cermignano** – Mr. Robert Cermignano, our Coordinator of Parish Services for the past two years, has announced that he will be leaving his position here to take a job in his father's business. I want to thank Robert for his excellent work here. He was instrumental in helping to guide the development of a pastoral plan for the Parish and has given graciously of his time and talent to assist in the mission of our Parish. On behalf of the Parish I extend to him our sincere gratitude and our heartfelt best wishes in his new endeavors.

**Capital Projects** – It is important to keep our buildings and facilities in good condition. So the Finance Council has approved several capital projects for this Summer and Fall. 1 - The front steps of the Rectory and Parish Offices are in bad shape and beginning to crumble, so they will be replaced and new railings will be installed (cost: \$5,000). 2 - A couple of years ago we began repairing and replacing some of the pointing on the Church. We did the front of the Church and the back of the Church. This year we will move toward completion of the project by taking care of the wall on the rectory side of the Church (cost: \$18,000). 3 - For many years, when it rains heavily we have had some water come into the Antioch Annex in the area by the room where there is a sink and which we used for storage of refreshment supplies. We are having a French drain installed in that area to alleviate the water intrusion problem and rebuilding the wall in the room which was torn down to assess the water leakage (cost: \$7,500). 4 - Two of the staff offices in the rectory will be painted and get new carpeting (cost: \$9,000). 5 - A portion of the rectory roof needs to be replaced (cost: \$8,500). 6 - A fence with a gate that opens will be installed between the front and back parking lots at the School. The fence will be able to be closed while the students are in School to provide a safer environment, and the gates will be able to be closed later at night to prevent people from misusing the school grounds. The gates can open to provide access to the back play yard for parking and other needs as required (cost: \$17,000). 7 - Some of the carpeting in the classrooms is showing its age. We are planning to replace the carpeting in a few of the rooms with a flooring that will be easier to clean (cost: approximately \$6,000). 8 – Another door will be installed in the foyer of the School on the gym side. This door will be able to be locked during School hours so that only those with keys will be able to access the gym and cafeteria area once they enter through the front door of the School (cost: \$5,000). The funding for these projects (total cost of \$76,000) will be drawn from the money budgeted for maintenance for the fiscal year 2019- 2020 (approximately \$40,000) and the rest from the Parish capital reserves, which have built up over the years because of your generosity. We currently have a reserve of over \$400,000 in our Capital Reserve Fund. The number of projects this year is more than usual, but the Finance Council deemed that they were all necessary and good improvements at this time and the funds are available for them.

**Pastoral Council Meeting** – The Parish Pastoral Council met on June 5, 2019. Present at the meeting were: Monica Lu-Romeo, Bess Combs-Chmielewski, George Gazella, Robert McCairns, Martha Ortiz, Bruce Fay, Marybeth Hagan, Robert Cermignano, Mary Anne Monroe, and Monsignor Dougherty. The meeting opened with a prayer. An article on deepening our relationship with Christ was read and discussed. Announcements were made regarding: Robert Cermignano's decision to leave his position here and take a job with his family (all members commended Robert for the good work he has done here); Operation Rice Bowl; Holy Week; BlueFest; the seminarian with us for the summer, Ivan Roque; the ReStore Collection for Habitat for Humanity; the upcoming Ice Cream Social; and the end of School. Reports were given on: the Adult Faith Formation Lenten Series and the ReBoot presentation by Chris Stefanick this coming October; the Parish Finances and forthcoming Capital Projects; the new Knights of Columbus Council and the work they are undertaking; Youth Ministry; and the work of the Liturgy Committee. Discussion took place on some possible ways of improving the Antioch Annex to better serve our Parish needs, and on how to implement the Parish theme (The Family: A Communion of Life and Love) for Fall, 2019 - Fall, 2020. Some members of the Council have been serving now for many years. Msgr. Dougherty will invite some people to join the Council as new members.

**Little Sisters of the Poor** - Tickets for the annual drawing for the support of the work of the Little Sisters of the Poor in caring for the elderly will be sold outside Church after all the Masses next weekend. Tickets are \$150 each. Only 2,000 are sold. There are prizes of \$25,000, \$10,000 and \$5,000. Your support would be much appreciated.

### **ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

### **COMMUNION CALLS**

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

### **SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. ### **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE**

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months.
