TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Widely considered one of the cornerstones of western classical music, Beethoven's fifth symphony is one of the most frequently played, and most easily recognized. Its four opening notes are known world wide, and they can be heard even in commercials and other pop culture versions. We can probably all hum the "short, short, short long" notes of it if we want, perhaps ahead of some big announcement.

Similarly St. Luke's gospel, also a cornerstone of our faith, has a consistent theme that runs through it. Not a musical one, of course, but one of mercy and healing written for Gentiles, all those non-Jewish readers of the time. Luke's masterpiece is from the outset a message of good news to the wide world, beyond that of the Jews.

In this weekend's selection, Jesus has already started on His long journey to Jerusalem, a main thread of Luke's writing leading to Holy Week. Along His way, He now comes to Samaria, land of the people so hated by the Jews. There He meets ten lepers and cures them. But, to His dismay, only one healed man comes back to thank Him. A disgraceful 10 percent gratitude return! And who is the man but a Samaritan! He is the first of two "Good Samaritans" Jesus will talk about.

For now, please concentrate, if you will, on Our Lord's very human reaction. You can almost hear it in His voice. "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has no one but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" Note two things here. First, that Jesus doesn't use the word 'Samaritan,' out of kindness or perhaps to avoid any hint of racism.

Secondly, He gives the credit to God for the cure, although He later will reveal that He could have said it of Himself. Do you also hear sadness in His voice, one that often comes when love is unrequited? I can even imagine putting those feelings as a lyric to fit Beethoven's famous four notes: "O Look how sad!"

That question "Where are the other nine?" has a way of rolling down the centuries right to us. In a way, it embraces all the ingratitude to God that we his free-willed creatures, massed since creation. Sadly, that number includes most of us at times. We have been given so much by our good God, and yet our prayers mostly include requests for even more.

Here is one of those rhetorical questions characteristic of homilies and waiting for the hearer's answer: "Are you grateful to God?" If we're honest with ourselves, our answer could prove embarrassing, leading us to a form of despair. But the good news is that our God loves us too much to hold our discourtesy over our heads. One sincere act of contrition, followed by praise of Him for His unfathomable goodness to us, you and me, and He smiles and reaches out to hug us as only He can.

From the Pastor

ReBoot Revisited - After all the Masses next weekend, we invite you to come to the Annex for refreshments and to share your experience of ReBoot and some thoughts on how we can build on it.

Insert on Emergency Exits – Several months ago I attended a meeting of the Main Line Ministerium, a gathering of local priests, ministers and rabbis from neighborhood congregations. An officer from the Lower Merion Police Department spoke to us concerning security and emergency procedures for our houses of worship. He suggested that we communicate some general information to our people on these matters. The insert in today's Bulletin contains some pertinent information provided to us on this issue.

Canonical Visitation – Msgr. Daniel Kutys, who assists Archbishop Chaput as the Vicar General for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, was here last Saturday, October 5 for an official canonical visitation of the Parish. These visits occur every five years and are conducted by one of the Bishops of the Archdiocese or another person from the central administration of the Archdiocese. The visits are a means by which the Archbishop is apprised of the state of Parish life in the Archdiocese.

Mission Speaker – The Church has designated next Sunday as Mission Sunday, a time to learn about the missionary endeavors of the Church. We will have a visiting priest, Fr. Moroda, here to speak at all the Masses. Father belongs to a religious community involved with missionary work and will share his knowledge and experience of the missions with us.

Hospitality Sunday – Next Sunday, October 20, will be a Hospitality Sunday here. We are planning this year to have Hospitality Sunday on the third Sunday of every month. Refreshments will be available after the 7:30 and 10:00 am Masses. We will also be asking you about your experience of Reboot and how we might be able to build on it.

Knights of Columbus – The Knights will meet this Wednesday, October 16 at 7:00 pm in the Annex.

Church Teaching: The Church is Holy – Christ, holy, innocent, and undefiled, knew nothing of sin, but came only to expiate the sins of the people. The Church, however, clasping sinners to her bosom, at once holy and always in need of purification, follows constantly the path of penance and renewal. All members of the Church, including her ministers, must acknowledge that they are sinners. In everyone, the weeds of sin will be mixed with the good wheat of the Gospel until the end of time. Hence the Church gathers sinners already caught up in Christ's salvation but still on the way to holiness: the Church is therefore holy, though having sinners in her midst, because she herself has no other life but the life of grace. If they live her life, her members are sanctified; if they move away from her life, they fall into sins and disorders that prevent the radiation of her sanctity. This is why she suffers and does penance for those offenses, of which she has the power to free her children through the Blood of Christ and the gift of the Holy Spirit. ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. [The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Thursday, October 24, 2019 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.](#)

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. REGISTRATION

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for reception of the Sacraments and letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist).
