FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

"CGI." For movie makers and fans, the letters stand for "Computer Generated Imagery." That encompasses those special visual effects created using computer software. For example, those vast crowds or great armies need not be made of paid "extras" any more. Besides movies, this process is used to contribute also to images in art, printed media, video games, TV programs, shorts, commercials, videos, and simulators. "The evolution of CGI led to the emergence of virtual cinematography in the 1990s where runs of the simulated camera are not constrained by the laws of physics."

I want to point out that along with the cost benefits of this technology comes a distrust of what we see via all kinds of screens which aligns with the abundance of lies all around us in the real world.

All this is the cultural context in which we ponder the ancient gospel story of the raising of Lazarus. It was up 'til then the most stupendous miracle Our Lord Jesus worked. But even the Gospels, the very literal Word of God, can become suspect in the cynical air in which we breathe these days. It is good to recall some facts included in this episode by St. John to convince anyone with an open mind of the truth of what he writes. Long long before there was CGI.

First we note how Jesus orders a time lag between the death of Lazarus and His arrival at the tomb, so that there can be no mistake that Lazarus was indeed dead and buried. "Lazarus was not in a coma. He had been dead for a long enough time (four days) that the rabbinic authorities would have said that the soul had left the vicinity of the body and decay would have definitely set in." We have all seen enough cops and criminals movies and TV shows to know how awful the stink of decay must be as the characters react to it. Practical St. Martha had told Jesus "There will be a bad smell Lord. He has been buried four days."

Secondly, we find Jesus "glad" of the death for His disciples' sake because this will provide a motive for the disciples' belief in Him.

Thirdly, the purpose of the miracle was to make "the glory of God the Father" manifest so that the people will believe Jesus was sent by Him." In other words, Jesus did not do this for the sake of His own glory and fame.

All through Lent we have had much encouragement as believers. Early on we had the Transfiguration; then His interaction with a Samaritan woman at the well; the healing of a man born blind. And now this incomparable raising of a dead man to life. As a result, we know for sure that our faith in Christ is not in vain. We follow the most honest Person who ever walked on this planet. Lenten penance and prayer help to make our amends for having offended Him by our sins.

Yes at times all of us have moments of doubt. Especially when life presents us with unwelcome surprises and crises. But then it is that we can help ourselves by remembering the father of that boy who had been possessed and who brought his son to Jesus. When Jesus extolled his faith, the same father responded, "Lord, I believe. Help my unbelief." As a weak man myself, it's one of my favorite prayers.

From the Pastor

Private Masses - For the first time in my priesthood I have been celebrating Mass in private every day without a congregation. The Mass by its very nature is social; it is an act of worship by the Body of Christ with the priest serving in the place of Christ the Head of the Body. Even without a congregation physically present, the Mass is offered by the priest in union with the people of God. The Mass benefits not only the priest, but has a cosmic effect. The saving power of Christ's death and resurrection is made present for us through the celebration of the Mass, and that power of Christ's grace goes out to all the world. So, although I am celebrating Mass privately, I am very aware of its public effects. Its saving power goes out to all the people of our Parish and indeed to all the world. God is still with us and he is most powerfully present through the celebration of the Eucharist. At every Mass I am thinking of all of you and extending to you God's grace and life. Even in this time when you cannot attend public Mass, be aware of the power of the Eucharist, open your heart to the Lord's grace. Try to view a Mass on Sunday to heighten your awareness and experience of the Eucharist's power, make a prayer of spiritual communion, and continue to pray, read and learn about the Lord and his gifts of faith, hope and love that come to us through the Church.

Act of Spiritual Communion

When we are unable to attend Mass in person, the Church encourages us to make an act of spiritual communion. I have included one here for your benefit:

My Jesus, I believe that Thou art present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love Thee above all things, and I desire Thee in my soul. Since I cannot now receive Thee sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart with the healing power of your saving presence. I welcome you with great joy and ask that you fill me with your life and peace. Filled with your grace, may my whole being radiate the light of your goodness.

FORMED – With our out of home activities being curtailed, there are many opportunities online for spiritual growth and faith formation. The Parish has a subscription to **FORMED**, an online service that carries many excellent resources on our Catholic faith. Because of our subscription, you are able to access the resources for free. Our parish code is WRVZND. Go to <u>https://formed.org</u>. When you click on "Sign Up," you should see the registration box for parishioners. Type in the parish code. Now set up a username and a password. Then you are all set to use all the great programs on FORMED.org anytime by simply logging in.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE FOR LENT

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, February 26, 2020, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

All are encouraged to participate in Operation Rice Bowl which has aided countless hungry persons here in the Archdiocese as well as throughout our nation and our world.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Wednesday, April 29, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. Engaged couples preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage can register, explore possible dates or find out more information for pre-marriage classes by visiting PhilaMarriagePrep.com.
