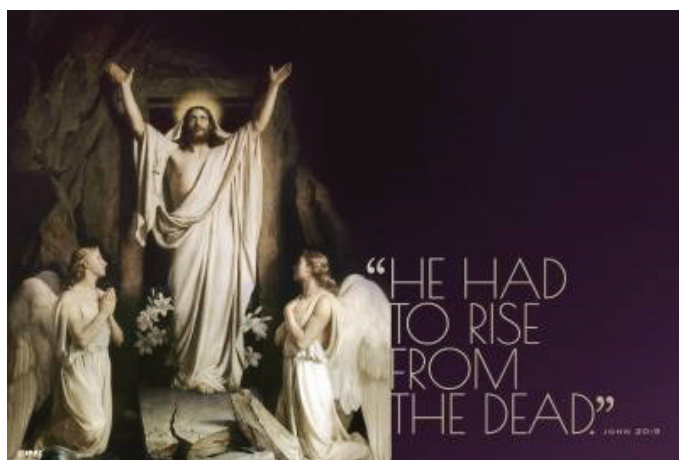

EASTER SUNDAY

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

If you wish to time-travel backward, with your mind cleared of all that you know from the bible and the Church's post resurrection teachings, suddenly you are there in that rented room where Jesus' chosen Apostles have been hiding in fear since last Friday. It is Sunday morning early, when Mary Magdalene bursts into the scene with the unsettling news: "His tomb is empty!" Fully expecting that the men would know what to do, she is puzzled by their initial reaction. They wonder "Is she hallucinating? Or lost her mind completely from some kind of lover's shock?"

Hurriedly you put on your cloak to join Peter and John on their hasty reaction and head straight for the place of His tomb. The huge stone is rolled back! There's a soldier's helmet on the ground, along with several spears. Their night campfire still glows hot. "The Roman guards must have left in a hurry," you and they think. You wait for Peter and his younger friend to exit and then you also look in to see the burial cloths. You note how the head cover is carefully folded apart from the body shroud. You remember what He had often said about the Third Day. You can't help yourself from believing the impossible has happened. His tomb is empty!

I offer this flight of fancy on this glorious Easter day as a way for us to enter into the scene of that first Easter morning so long ago. Here because this is where it all started. This "acid test" of our belief is right there at the empty tomb. It is also the site from which we walk away astounded and amazed, light-headed from trying to calculate what effects this will have on our way of thinking and acting from now on. Slowly we conclude that now there are only two real choices in life: for Jesus or against Him. And why? Because His tomb is empty.

There have been, right from the beginning of Christianity, multiple reasons to doubt. Layers of pessimism produced over the centuries by the cynics who choose to disbelieve. Happenings and headlines as fresh as this morning are capable of inducing despair about the human race in general, and your own hopes in particular. A catalog of compromises is available if you want to remain neutral and unbothered. But His tomb is empty!

Monuments galore dot the landscapes of countries world wide to honor past heroes and heroines. These tributes in steel or stone mark their graves because we want to notify the present and the future of their virtues lived and decisions made that either reflected their bravery or molded their credo. But Jesus' tomb is empty! There are no such monuments to Him anywhere because His memorial is elsewhere. In human hearts that believe and love Him.

And so we come together today to do what Christians have done for centuries: to hear the Word and break the Bread because Jesus said "Do this in memory of Me." "Don't waste your time and energy on monuments," He might have added. In reality, He did predict for our encouragement: "In the world you will have affliction; but take courage, I have overcome the world." No empty promise there. In fact, the only emptiness on Easter was, and is...His tomb! Alleluia!

A blessed Easter to you and yours.

From the Pastor

Easter Joy on the Road to Emmaus – After the death of Jesus, two of his disciples were downcast and filled with sadness. They considered that the hopes they had placed in Jesus had not been realized and dejectedly they headed back home. A stranger appeared to them on the road and entered into conversation with them. He wanted to know all that was in their hearts and on their minds. Through his words about the Scriptures and his action of breaking the bread at a meal with them, the two soon came to realize that this was no stranger, it was the Lord Jesus himself.

As we face the pandemic of the coronavirus and all the suffering it has brought and restrictions it has placed on us, there is a sad and downhearted spirit that weighs on us. But as we celebrate Easter, our spirits are lifted up by the great truth of our faith that the Lord is risen. The Lord is with us. At every Mass the priest says to the congregation five times, “The Lord be with you.” He says it so often because the priest is expressing our deepest desire, that the Lord not abandon us, but stay with us always. The Lord heeds this call. He is with us. He stays with us always and brings new life to even the most dire of situations, suffering and death. The two disciples on the road made a simple request of the Lord, “Stay with us.” The Lord heeded their desire and stayed with them. He is with us, too, wanting to enter into conversation with us and hear all about what is in our minds and on our hearts, and wanting us to know that he is alive and brings his life-giving power to every situation.

For many years I had a very small depiction of the Lord walking with the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. It hung by my door, to remind me as I went out, that wherever I went, the Lord would be with me. In one of my moves, it got lost in the shuffle, but it has always stayed in my mind and heart. May we all be aware of the Lord’s loving presence with us so that even in difficult times we can have Easter joy.

Divine Mercy Sunday – Next Sunday, April 19, the Second Sunday of Easter, is Divine Mercy Sunday. Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska was a Sister of Our Lady of Mercy in Poland. She was born in 1905 and died in 1938. Through a series of revelations to her, the Lord asked her to disseminate further the truth of God’s compassionate mercy. Pope John Paul II declared some years ago that the Sunday after Easter would be particularly dedicated to recalling the mercy of God and his attentive love for each one of us. A devotion promoted by Sister Faustina was the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Information on how to pray the Chaplet is available online and in a pamphlet in the vestibule of the Church.

Catholic Charities Appeal 2020 – The Catholic Social Services Delaware County Family Service Center in Chester is one of seven Catholic Social Services Family Service Centers throughout the Archdiocese. These Centers are some of the many entities supported by the Catholic Charities Appeal. In Chester, 72% of the households with 4 people or more, are living below the poverty line. The Center helps families to find housing, employment, emergency rent and utility assistance, food and baby items. A Prayer to Mary in our Time of Need – O Mary, you always shine on our path as a sign of salvation and hope. We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick, who at the cross took part in Jesus’ pain, keeping your faith firm. You know what we need, and we are sure you will provide so that, as in Cana of Galilee, we may return to joy and to feasting after this time of trial. Help us, Mother of Divine Love, to conform to the will of the Father and to do as we are told by Jesus, who has taken upon himself our sufferings, and carried our sorrows to lead us, through the cross, to the joy of the resurrection. Under your protection, we seek refuge, Holy Mother of God. Do not disdain the entreaties of we who are in trial, but through your intercession deliver us from every danger, O glorious and blessed Virgin. Amen.

Church Teaching: The Resurrection of Our Lord – The Paschal Mystery has two aspects: by his death, Christ liberates us from sin; by his Resurrection, he opens for us the way to a new life. This new life is above all justification that reinstates us in God’s grace, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. Justification consists in both the victory over death caused by sin and a new participation in grace. It brings about filial adoption so that men become Christ’s brethren, as Jesus himself called his disciples after his Resurrection: “Go and tell my brethren.” We are brethren not by nature, but by the gift of grace, because that adoptive filiation gains us a real share in the life of the only Son, which was fully revealed in his Resurrection. (from the Catechism of the Catholic Church)

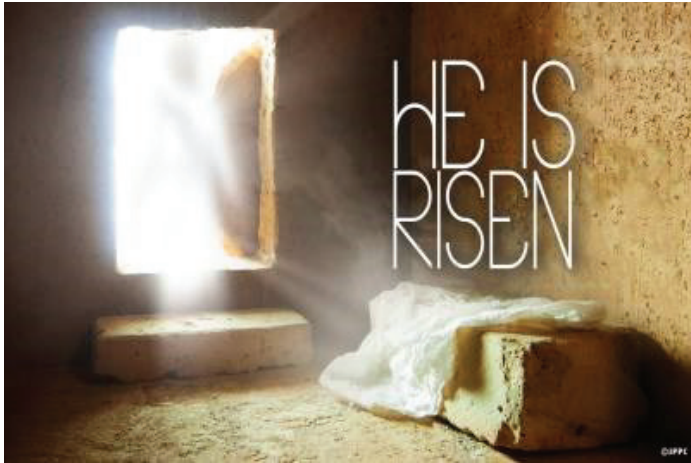

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Wednesday, April 29, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. Engaged couples preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage can register, explore possible dates or find out more information for pre-marriage classes by visiting **PhilaMarriagePrep.com**. REGISTRATION

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for reception of the Sacraments and letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Please call the rectory for an appointment if you need a certificate.

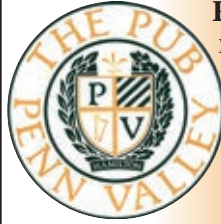
