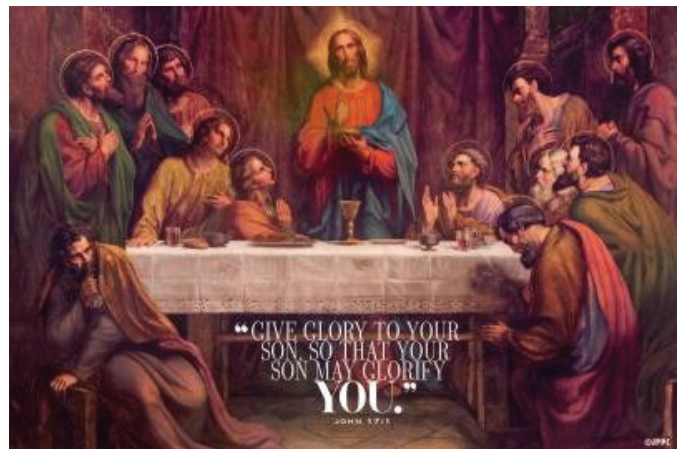

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

There is a touching scene in the film "Becket" where an obstreperous young religious brother that the Archbishop (played by Richard Burton) has brought on as an aide accidentally overhears his master praying. The great man's words bespeak of humility and courage, enough to change the brother's attitude to one of reverence rather than rebellion. It is a blessing of our Church that we get to "overhear" the authentic prayers of many of our great saints, with no script writer intervening. Giants of the past like Augustine and Teresa of Avila mingle with people like favorites of mine Thomas More and John Henry Newman. This not to exclude John Paul II and Mother Teresa, all of whom lead up to Our Lady herself. Her few recorded words in Scripture are unmatched.

But what if we could "overhear" Jesus Himself? What a gift! Of course, we are blest to have many of His prayers in the New Testament. But in today's gospel, we listen as He just pours out His heart on the eve of His Passion. His disciples must have stopped their eating and turned with rapt attention, even if they had no idea of what was about to happen to their Master. St. John's gospel lets us listen in.

Note the intense love of the Son for His Father. We will later on learn from St. John that "God is love." But here Jesus shows it. He begins by acknowledging that His "hour" has come. The awful "hour" that will forever mark our Fridays. Then He asks for "glory." Not for Himself to hoard, but so that He may glorify the Father. He has accomplished His given task, which we know was all about redeeming us.

In this time of quarantine and close family living, there are probably a lot of stories that emerge from children now gathered daily at mealtime. The following is a very realistic and amusing one that also involves overhearing. *A little boy and his brother went to visit their grandmother. As the little boy said his prayers, he was shouting at the top of his voice, "Please God, send me a bicycle, send me a cell phone," and all that. His brother said, "Not so loud. For crying out loud, God isn't deaf." The little boy replied, "Yes I know, but grandma is."*

From the Pastor

Memorial Day – This holiday weekend we especially remember those who gave their lives on behalf of the ideals of our nation. The freedom we enjoy today is because of their valor and the ultimate sacrifice of their own lives. May we prayerfully remember them with gratitude. May the remembrance of their service encourage us to seek always to promote liberty and justice for all. We express our gratitude, too, for all the men and women who have served and are serving in our armed forces. Their service enables us to enjoy the blessings of freedom and security.

Summary of Finance Council Meeting by Zoom on May 6 (Members are: Msgr. Dougherty, Anne Becker, John Braun, Cliff Coombs, Michelene Fliszar, Mary Anne Johnston, Christopher Klock, Lyle Nehls, Martha Ortiz, Mark Rooney, and John Shea) - 1) Third Quarter Financial Report: Church income was comparable to last year in this quarter. School income has been affected by the pandemic. Income was lost because of the need to cancel the Maggie's Pub fundraiser and from the cessation of the CARES before and after school program. In the operating accounts, we are projecting that for this fiscal year the School will break even and the Church will finish about \$75,000 in the black. This money is then put toward necessary capital expenses. 2) Capital projects: a) The extensive repair of the sidewalks for the School and Church and the retaining wall in front of school will commence in mid-June. This is necessary for safety purposes (cost - about \$44,000). b) A drainage trough will be installed in the rear parking lot to help with water runoff and the entire parking lot will be resealed (cost – about \$17,000). c) We are still planning this summer to remove the carpet in Church in the hope that the stone floor beneath can be refurbished, and to move the baptismal font to a few pews from the front entrance of the Church. d) Plans for doing some renovations in the Antioch Annex have been put on hold because of the pandemic and its possible effects on Parish income. e) We are planning to replace the Phone system in the Parish offices and School (cost – about \$4,000). 3) Budgets for next fiscal year for the Church and School have been prepared and will be submitted soon to the Archdiocese. 4) The Parish has kept all its employees for the Church and School on the payroll throughout the coronavirus quarantine and has received a loan from the government Paycheck Protection Program. We are currently researching with the Archdiocese and the government concerning the stipulations for forgiveness of this loan. 5) The next meeting will be on August 12.

Summary of School Advisory Board Meeting on May 7 (Members are: Msgr. Dougherty; Steve DiRico, President; Anne Becker; Robert Caskey; Peg Garofolo; Mary Anne Johnston; Rebecca Klick; Monica Lawrence; Sean Marzolf; Mark Rooney; John Shea; Sean Stevens; Nicole Veith; and David Walker) – 1) Report from Pastor: Monsignor thanked everyone (Mrs. Johnston, teachers, parents and students) for their great response to the altered circumstances for our School because of the pandemic. He reported on the discussions at the Finance Council regarding this year's budget and the capital projects explained above. 2) Report from the Principal: Mrs. Johnston explained all the efforts undertaken at instructing the students remotely. We discussed several possible scenarios for the resumption of School in the Fall. The shape that will take depends on guidance we receive from the government and the Archdiocese. 3) Report from Home and School: Monica Lawrence reported on another successful year for Home and School Activities. The Father–Daughter Dance was conducted on ZOOM by Beth Mirzai and turned out to be a very enjoyable event. Although Maggie's Pub was canceled, it still realized about \$20,000 in donations to the School. Many thanks to Monica and Stephanie Seal and the other helpers for the many hours they spent working on Maggie's Pub. 4) Report from the Finance Committee – Mark Rooney reported the losses of some usual income because of the cancellation of Maggie's Pub and the end of the CARES Program for the year, but the School is anticipated to break even in its operating budget for this year. 5) Facilities Committee – Sean Marzolf offered advice and assistance on overseeing the capital projects, as stated in the Finance Council report above, to be completed this summer. 6) Report from the Marketing and Development Committee: Anne Becker mentioned that we received some funds from the Archdiocese to assist parents who might be struggling to pay tuition because of the adverse effects of the pandemic. Several families applied for and received some help. She is continuing to work to procure some grant money for the additional security we added to the School last year and for a Program on helping the emotional growth of the students. 7) Technology Report: the chrome books we have given to the students to use have been working well and the shift to remote learning has gone well. We are in the process of procuring some more chrome books and some ipads for the younger students. 8) Discussion was continued on how the pandemic will affect the next School Year. Contingency plans are underway but there is still guidance we have to wait on from the government before determining how we can proceed.

9) Membership: The children of Dave Walker and Mark Rooney have completed eighth grade so they will be moving on from the Board. We are grateful for the service they extended. Mark has served as the head of the Finance Committee for many years and Dave joined us a few years ago. Their advice and help have been invaluable. Monsignor asked that if anyone had names of people to suggest as possible Board members to let him know. After discussion with Mrs. Johnston and Steve DiRico, some people will be approached over the summer to consider becoming Board members. 10) The Board advised that at this time we should not pursue making our Board one of Limited Jurisdiction.

Gratitude to the Home and School Association – On behalf of our Parish, I want to thank the members of the Board of the Home and School Association for all they do to support our School. Special thanks to Monica Lawrence (President), Stephanie Seal (Vice-President) and Betsy Harvey (Secretary), who are completing their two-year terms. Their efforts were very helpful in supporting and improving our School. May God bless them for the selfless service they gave in these positions of leadership.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Thursday, May 28, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. 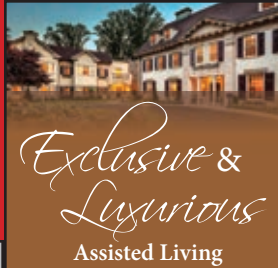
