Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Cliches. Those words or phrases that pop up in our conversations springing from a collection of them we've acquired over time. We are as comfortable with them as when we're wearing an old pair of loafers, which we might have done throughout the recent Covid lock down. Some common examples: "Let's touch base." "I'm like a kid in a candy store." "We're not laughing at you, we're laughing with you" and "Read between the lines." I'd like to apply just one for our reflection: "Honesty is the best policy."

Supposedly that last one originated with our own Ben Franklin. But Shakespeare had written much earlier: "If I lose mine honor I lose myself." Mark Twain typically adds a touch of sardonic humor: "Honesty is the best policy when there's money in it." Our sage Thomas Jefferson is appropriately thoughtful: "Honesty is the first chapter in the book of wisdom." Finally, Mother Saint Teresa tells us: "Honesty and transparency make you vulnerable. Be honest anyway."

For my purpose, I refer to Our Lord's dictum, not a cliché at all I think, that to be His disciples: "Whoever wishes to come after Me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow Me." Once again, we have here a case of Our Lord Jesus being totally, if not brutally honest. So transparent that He sets the bar rather high on what it really means to be a disciple, you might add to be a brother or sister to Him. Yes, honesty is the best policy but not the most likable.

I always had a suspicion that there is a tamping down of this belief among some popular televangelists. I think you know the ones whom I mean. The backdrop of their often "feel good" sermons before an adoring crowd never features a cross, much less a crucifix (and there is a difference!) There is rarely a mention of taking up a cross in one's daily life, because Christianity for them is always pure joy and happiness. Some assign material prosperity as a guarantee of gospel living. It's all indirectly resurrection and very little passion and death. Perhaps I exaggerate but it is how I perceive them.

We know better. And if we're transparently honest, living out Christianity is not easy all the time. Especially in our present Western culture, which identifies wealth as a sign of one's value and importance. We applaud the limousine riders of our day, even rushing to take a "selfie" with them whenever possible. Who among us would rush toward a beaten Man wearing a crown of thorns that makes His blood trickle down to His eyes?

On the other hand, true honesty has to admit that while belief in uniting one's suffering with that of Christ (the old "offer it up" line) may ease the pain, it does not remove it. Ask any martyr. But at least we know the pain can be spiritually enriching. I think of that every time I'm in the dentist's chair. But wherever you think of it, hold on to it as the honest truth. It's not a cliché,

"Pain insists upon being attended to. God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our conscience, and shouts in our pain. It is His megaphone to rouse a deaf world." (C. S. Lewis, *The Problem Pain*) God love you, and give you His peace!

From the Pastor

Back to School – Saint Margaret School opens tomorrow, Monday, August 31. In accord with the recommendations of the Pennsylvania Department of Health for school openings in Montgomery County to either be hybrid or all virtual and in accord with the expectations of the Archdiocese that we observe these recommendations, we will begin school with a hybrid model. Half of the students will come on Mondays and Tuesdays and the other half on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Friday will be an all virtual day. Some parents are opting at this time for their children to participate virtually full time. When students are at home they will be expected to participate in their classes online. All of the classes will be livestreamed and the teachers will be able to see the students at home on the large screen televisions in the classrooms. We hope that the rate of infection will drop to the point where we can resume school fully in person for all of our students. I extend my sincere thanks to Mrs. Johnston, our principal, and to all the staff and students of SMS for their dedicated efforts in preparing for this School Year.

We extend our prayers and best wishes to all the students in our Parish at every level of education who will be resuming another school year. These are different times for schooling and we ask God to give all of us patience, perseverance and peace in the midst of the challenges that are being faced. No matter what the circumstances, we trust that the Lord will provide.

Capital Projects – It was a busier than usual summer for maintenance and capital projects in the Parish. Concrete work to repair sidewalks of the Church, School and Rectory was completed. The parking lot was resealed. A drainage trough was installed in the back parking lot to help manage the water runoff. Part of the School Library was used to make a new first grade classroom and new flooring was installed in five classrooms. Two sheds are being purchased to act as storage for the School. The wall in the front of the School was reset. Plans for repairs to the sanctuary floor in Church are being pursued. The projects have added aesthetic and very practical values to our Parish campus. Your generosity to the Church makes it possible for us to make the needed repairs and enhancements. Thank you for your support of our Parish.

R.C.I.A. – The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults Classes will be resuming on Tuesday evening, September 15. These classes on our faith help to prepare those who are interested in becoming Catholic, as well as those who were baptized Catholic but are still in need of receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation and/or Holy Eucharist. If you are not able to attend on Tuesday evenings or in person, arrangements can be made for alternative times and ways of learning about the faith, If you are interested in participating, or have any questions about our Catholic faith and the reception of the sacraments, contact Msgr. Church Teaching: The Altar and the Saints – In the Church's history and tradition, the altar was often placed over the tombs of the saints or the relics of the saints were deposited beneath the altar. The presence of the relics of saints in the altar provides a witness to the Church's belief that the Eucharist celebrated on the altar is the source of the grace that won sanctity for the saints. The custom of placing small relics of martyrs or the saints in an altar stone and setting this in the mensa (table top of the altar) has changed since the Second Vatican Council. Relics of martyrs or other saints may be placed beneath the altar, as long as they are of undoubted authenticity. Relics are no longer placed on the altar or set into the mensa in an altar stone. ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Wednesday, September 16, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist).
