Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

When I was “one and twenty,” a very long time ago, I was a seminarian naive to many ways of the world. On vacation at home one morning, my beloved Dad asked me questions about the very parable we hear this weekend. For background purposes, let me tell you that my Dad was a strong union man, and thought that was the workers’ only protection against unfair management practices. So how do I reconcile the Lord Jesus telling a story about what looks like a contradiction of justice?

I cannot remember my answer to Dad at the time. I’m sure I struggled to defend Jesus’ decision. Admittedly, no seminary Scripture class in my time ever covered every verse in Scripture, much less this selection. It was only years later that I learned what Jesus was all about in telling this parable. It was to teach us about the remarkable generosity of God. It was the very same lesson that Isaiah had taught centuries before. God’s ways are not ours. So it is futile to “frame” the picture painted by the parable with our modern labor laws, rights and practices. We then would miss the Lord’s point.

In our time, overshadowed as it is by an enemy named Covid 19, we have been made aware of many people’s generosity. They keep our cynicism in check. Health care workers, emergency responders; the transit workers; grocery store employees; and all the good police personnel bravely keep us safe.

But none of that goodness can match the generosity that our good and loving God offers us. His grace is the ultimate motivation of all those good people, and many others.

There is a much older “virus” plaguing our lives called “sin.” Yet He tells us still that one act of genuine sorrow and repentance turns back His just cause for eternal punishment, and realigns our spirit with His. Such is His boundless generosity! We are far from it. Sadly many of us have a twisted attitude toward giving, especially forgiving.

Once upon a time, a little girl was given two dollars by her father. He told her that she could do anything she wanted with one and that the other was to be given to God on Sunday at church. The girl nodded in agreement and asked if she could go to the candy store. With visions of all that she could buy with her dollar, she happily skipped toward the store, holding tightly to the two dollars in her hand. As she was skipping along, she tripped and fell and the wind blew one of the dollars into a storm drain at the curb. Picking herself up, the little girl looked at the dollar still in her hand and then at the storm drain and said, “Well. Lord, there goes your dollar.”

From the Pastor

Spiritual Breaks – With so many of our students doing their school work online, we all realize that at times during the day they need virtual breaks. Too much time online overloads us and wears us down. We need some breaks. Even beyond the online phenomenon, we all need some breaks from the work of life and all the energy invested in getting things done and managing the circumstances of our lives. We need some time to step aside from all the work and all the effort involved in caring for material and external realities. We need some breaks from all the concrete details of life in order to renew our spirits and pay attention to what is within, in the depths of our souls. Taking time for Mass, for daily prayer and some quiet prayer and reflection feeds our spirit and keeps us grounded in the most important part of life, our relationship with God and his presence within us. Take some breaks from the daily rigors of life to focus on your spirit. A strong spirit renews our energy and allows the power of God to work more powerfully through us.

First Penance – Many of our third grade students in St. Margaret School and in our Parish Religious Education Program (PREP) will celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation this week on either Wednesday, September 23 or Thursday, September 24 at 7:00 pm in the evening. Their reception of this Sacrament was originally scheduled for last Spring but has been delayed because of the Covid-19 restrictions. We rejoice with these children as they experience the power of the Lord's forgiveness extended to them through this Sacrament. Please keep them in your prayers this week.

Sanctuary Work – The repairs and renovations on the Church sanctuary are moving forward. The work on moving the baptismal font to a place closer to the entrance of the Church is now in process, and some of the work on the steps into the sanctuary and on the marble floor has begun. The process will take some time but it is good that it is now underway. The work will enhance the beauty of our Church and help us to experience God's presence there as we gather in Church for worship and prayer.

Mercy Day – September 24 is the feast day of Our Lady of Mercy. This title of Mary has special meaning for our Parish because the Sisters of Mercy served in our School until recently, when they were no longer able to staff it. However, we still consider ourselves a Mercy School and try to practice the mercy and compassion for all that stands at the heart of the mission and charism of the Sisters of Mercy. We ask Our Lady of Mercy to watch over our School and Parish and to inspire all of us to be ministers of kindness and mercy in our world.

Collection for the Archdiocese for Military Services Next Sunday – The special collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services will be taken up next weekend, September 26-27. This collection was originally scheduled for last Spring but was moved to next weekend because of the pandemic. Two baskets specifically marked for this Collection will be at the doors of Church next weekend. 



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Archdiocese for the Military Services was established by Saint John Paul II in 1985 to provide a full range of Catholic pastoral ministries to those in the United States Armed Forces.

The mission of the Archdiocese is to "serve those who serve" by offering pastoral care to Catholics serving in the U.S. military, enrolled in the nation's service academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers in the United States, Puerto Rico and Guam, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations. The Archdiocese and its priests and deacons are responsible for pastoral service to approximately 1.8 million Catholics. However, unlike a conventional diocese, the Archdiocese has no parishes or parish registries and no weekly collections. It relies solely on the generosity of private donations to support its programs and services.

Last year, Pope Francis told military ordinaries from around the world that "The role of military chaplains is to accompany and support [those in need] on the journey, to be a comforting and brotherly presence for them all." Your support of the Archdiocese for the Military Services will bring the Gospel, the sacraments and other forms of spiritual support to men and women who serve our country and defend our freedoms, including many individuals and families who hail from our own Greater Philadelphia region.

The collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, which was to be conducted during Lent but was postponed due to the suspension of Masses, will now be conducted in your parish on the weekend of September 26 and 27, 2020. I ask your continued prayers and generous financial support for this important collection.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Wednesday, October 21, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. Engaged couples preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage can register, explore possible dates or find out more information for pre-marriage classes by visiting PhilaMarriagePrep.com. REGISTRATION

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for reception of the Sacraments and letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Please call the rectory for an appointment if you need a certificate.
