Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

The History Channel is one of my favorites, especially when its programming matches its name. Over this summer I was able to watch a series called "The Men who Built America." It was all about the tycoons, sometimes tyrannical men who captured the industrial revolution and made it work both for them and for our burgeoning country. Allow me to single out Cornelius Vanderbilt, who expanded our country's railroads and made its expansion happen by ultimately connecting people from coast to coast. Of course, Cornelius himself never lifted a shovel. He labored over investments and the workers' paychecks being available.

On this eve of Labor Day, it must be said that railroad construction in those days was largely a matter of hand labor with picks and shovels. It was hard work to say the least, and it is amazing what the workers produced. But it is a good thing to celebrate all laborers in our own time, and to honor the good benefits of work.

It so happens that our Scriptures this weekend speak of a different kind of labor: very real and the complete opposite of gang work. It is called "fraternal correction." What is it? It is the "admonishing of one's neighbor by a private individual with the purpose of reforming him, or, if possible, preventing his sinful indulgence." So it is a private matter, usually between good friends, in which one takes the initiative in pointing out the other's incipient or ongoing problem. It's Harry or Harriet calling their close buddy aside and saying things like "You have bad halitosis," or "You've been drinking a lot lately," or "The boss is concerned that you're coming in late too much." The range is as wide as the human situation permits.

Granted, this is difficult, and we have a natural tendency to avoid it. We wonder whether, after offering our counsel, we will still have a friend. But if our friendship runs deeper than a surface kind of thing, it becomes essential.

This concept runs through the Old and New Testaments. We read today that Ezekiel is commanded to do it, and if he does not, he faces his own peril of death. Jesus practiced it. Recall His response when Peter urged Him to dismiss the idea of suffering and death as part of His mission: "Get behind Me, Satan!"

As consolation, presumably here to those of us who accept the challenge of correcting a brother or sister, Jesus offers His promise to be present when as little as two people are gathered in His name. He knows the difficulty. He admires our courage. He makes the generous gift.

In the movie "Chariots of Fire," young Harold Abrahams, a champion sprinter, had just suffered his first-ever defeat. After the race, he sat alone, pouting in the bleachers. When his girlfriend tried to encourage him, he bellowed, "If I can't win, I won't run!" To which she wisely, and with courage replied, "If you don't run, you can't win." God love you and give you His peace. And Happy Labor Day!

## From the Pastor

**Safety at Mass** – On August 19, Doctors Thomas McGovern, Timothy Flanigan (also a deacon), and Paul Cieslak authored an article on Mass attendance and COVID-19. The doctors state the evidence suggests that church services following public health guidelines do not present a greater risk of spreading the novel coronavirus than other similar activities. They wrote: “For Catholic Churches following the guidelines, no outbreaks of COVID-19 have been linked to Church attendance, even though we have examples...of asymptomatic, unknowingly infected individuals attending Mass and other parish functions. Their attendance could have led to an outbreak if appropriate precautions were not followed, yet in each case, we found no evidence of viral transmission.” The article continues: “This encouraging news should inspire confidence that the guidelines in place – based on CDC recommendations – are working to decrease COVID-19 transmission. While nothing during a pandemic is risk-free, these guidelines mean that Catholics (and public officials) may be confident that it is reasonably safe to come to Church for Mass and the sacraments.”

By dispensing from the obligation to attend Sunday Masses because of the pandemic, the Church recognizes that the circumstances of each of our lives vary and has given us the responsible freedom to make an informed decision about Sunday Mass attendance. I share the above data with you to assist you in making your decision regarding Church attendance at this time. St. Margaret Church has been open for public Mass since the weekend of June 6-7. Our parishioners have been observing the guidelines for attendance, and leaving the doors open during Mass has provided good ventilation. I was a little anxious about our return to Mass because our Church is rather small and a contained space. Although, as the article stated, nothing is risk-free during a pandemic, after a couple of months of public Mass, I can say that our Church has felt reasonably safe to me. I remind you that we now have added a Mass at 8:45am to help spread out the numbers who attend Mass on Sunday so that we can provide an appropriate social distance.

**Safe Environment Coordinator** – We are in need of a Safe Environment Coordinator for our Parish. The work involves ensuring that all our volunteers and staff have fulfilled all the safe environment requirements of the Office for Child and Youth Protection of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The work involves assisting those in need of safe environment clearances in procuring all the proper documents and training, and tracking whether staff and volunteers have completed their proper clearances and thus are free to help in our parish. The position involves about 8 hours of work per week and the hours are flexible. If you are interested, please contact Msgr. Work is a means by which we can participate in God’s creative work in the world and develop our human abilities and talents to a fuller extent. Workers should be accorded their rights and the proper respect. We ask God’s blessing on all workers and pray that they will value their work and be treated justly.

**PREP** – Our Parish Religious Education Program for the children who do not attend Catholic School will resume on Sunday, September 13. The children have the option this year of attending in-person or participating virtually. Mrs. Monroe, our Director of Religious Education, and all our catechists are looking forward to helping these young people grow in their faith.

**Seminarian** – Kenneth Omeke, a seminarian studying at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, interned here at St. Margaret’s in the summer. I recently received notice that the Seminary has assigned him to return to St. Margaret’s on Thursdays as part of the Seminary’s Program for Pastoral Formation. We are looking forward to his being with us each Thursday and helping him to learn about pastoral service through his participation in the life of our Parish. Also, since Ken is from Nigeria and does not have any family in the area, the Seminary has asked that St. Margaret’s Rectory become Ken’s local residence when he is on vacation from the Seminary.

**Collection for the Holy Land Shrines** – The Collection for the Maintenance of the Holy Land Shrines is usually taken up on Good Friday. Because of the pandemic, the Collection was rescheduled for next weekend, Sept. 12-13. In addition to the baskets for the regular Sunday Collection, there will be baskets in the back of Church specifically marked for this Collection. Please make a donation as the caretakers of the Holy Land Shrines depend on our help so that they can be properly maintained and enhanced.

**R.C.I.A.** – The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults Classes will be resuming on Tuesday evening, September 15. These classes on our faith help to prepare those who are interested in becoming Catholic, as well as those who were baptized Catholic but are still in need of receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation and/or Holy Eucharist. **Work on the Sanctuary in Church** - We are moving ahead with the necessary work. Tiles are being ordered for the step up into the sanctuary, and work will begin on the damaged area of the sanctuary floor by the BVM altar. Plans are underway to move the baptismal font to a place closer to the doors of the Church.

**Church Teaching: The Ambo** – The central focus of the area in which the word of God is proclaimed during the liturgy is the ambo. The design of the ambo and its prominent placement reflects the dignity and nobility of that saving word and draws the attention of those present to the proclamation of the word. Here the Christian community encounters the living Lord in the word of God and prepares itself for the “breaking of the bread” and the mission to live the word that will be proclaimed. The design of the altar and ambo should bear a harmonious and close relationship to one another in order to emphasize the close relationship between word and Eucharist. ### **ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

### **COMMUNION CALLS**

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

### **SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Wednesday, September 16, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**

### **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE**

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. Engaged couples preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage can register, explore possible dates or find out more information for pre-marriage classes by visiting **PhilaMarriagePrep.com**. ### **REGISTRATION**

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for reception of the Sacraments and letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

### **REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES**

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Please call the rectory for an appointment if you need a certificate.
