Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

This weekend we have our annual encounter with that strange man with an even stranger message. The Church wants us to hear from him each Advent season, so he becomes in fact “the man of Advent”: John the Baptist. His is a call to lift our minds and hearts up from undue concern about earthly prep for Christmas 2020 and consider the superior importance of spiritual preparation for the next coming of Christ.

After all, the ultimate reason for Christmas is the Incarnation, the taking on of a human nature of the Son of God, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. He truly becomes the “Emmanuel” foretold by the prophets, a title which means “God with us.”

In this early part of Advent, the focus turns to the matter of Christ’s second coming because that event should have a profound personal impact how we live each day. The first Coming, we know, is all joy and glory to God in the highest. That’s as it should be, as we note God’s eternal plan slowly coming to fruition with the birth of the holy Babe. The second coming is described in more frightening terms because then this Babe will have matured and will be coming as our Judge. That will also mark the end of the universe as we know it. So that inescapable moment of judgment we each face could well have a background we can only imagine. Frightening beyond words.

As if to shake us out of the sentimentality associated with Christmas, the Church presents us with Mark’s gospel, where he hurries past the birth tale to Jesus’ adult baptism in the Jordan. It marks the beginning of Our Lord’s brief time being personally present as God’s best emissary. Jesus launches His “campaign” if you will. We will come back to this event in a few weeks to mark the liturgical end of the Christmas season early next year.

Meanwhile, we must be careful not to turn John the Baptist into a kind of campaign manager. Rather, is he Our Lord’s precursor, the one who gets us ready to hear the Good News? Salvation history has come to its final chapter, after centuries of hoping for it. Thus does John the Baptist straddle both biblical testaments as the last prophet of the Old and the first of the New. The era of ultimate choice has arrived, and John is the first to make it known. In blunt terms, it is between Jesus and Satan.

Satan, you ask? Oh yes, he’s still around and very real. He is evil personified. We may not automatically think that way but every one of our sins is a vote cast for the evil one. This culture of ours has found a somewhat sleazy way out of living by objective morality by making everything subjective. So somebody might justify drinking too much at a Christmas party by thinking he/she deserves it “because 2020 has been a very bad year.” We should wonder just how such an excuse would hold up on Judgment Day. Tough and sober truth.

From the Pastor

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Tuesday, December 8 – Masses will be celebrated at 7:00 pm on Monday, December 7 and at 7:00 am, 12:05 pm and 7:00 pm on Tuesday, December 8. We honor Mary, who by the grace of God was conceived without sin in order to be a spotless vessel for Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Mary's untainted nature gives us great hope. She is the sign that God's grace has a profound effect upon us and cleanses us from sin. We hope one day to be cleansed of all sin in the kingdom of heaven. Mary is the guide to our heavenly home. She shows us how to give ourselves completely to God so that his love can cleanse and perfect us.

Advent Morning of Recollection, Saturday, December 12 – Father Thomas Whittingham, the pastor of Saint Katharine Drexel Parish in Chester, PA, will be with us on Saturday morning, December 12, the Feast of our Lady of Guadalupe, as we celebrate an Advent morning of recollection. Father will speak on the topic of the Blessed Virgin Mary at 9:00 am, followed by questions or sharing. From 10:00 – 11:00 am we will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Confessions will be heard. Join us to help make your Advent a time of spiritual renewal.

Parish Theme for This Year (“Rejoice in hope; endure in affliction; persevere in prayer.”) – The Blessed Mother is a primary figure in the celebration of Advent. She awaited the birth of our Savior with joyful expectation. Advent is the Season of joyful hope. It is a Season of watchful waiting. A fundamental attitude of a disciple of our Lord is always to be waiting in hope for his saving presence to come into our lives, sometimes dramatically, but most often in quiet and ordinary ways. Wait with Mary in joyful expectation for the Lord to come to you.

Church Teaching: The Resurrection and the Lord's Day – The resurrection of Jesus is the fundamental event upon which Christian faith rests. It is an astonishing reality, fully grasped in the light of faith, yet historically attested to by those who were privileged to see the Risen Lord. It is a wondrous event which is not only absolutely unique in human history, but which lies at the very heart of the mystery of time. In fact, “all time belongs to Christ and all the ages,” as the evocative liturgy of the Easter Vigil recalls in preparing the paschal candle. Therefore, in commemorating the day of Christ's resurrection not just once a year but every Sunday, the church seeks to indicate to every generation the true fulcrum of history, to which the mystery of the world's origin and its final destiny leads. It is right, therefore, to claim, in the words of a fourth century homily, that “the Lord's Day” is “the lord of days.” Those who have received the grace of faith in the Risen Lord cannot fail to grasp the significance of this day of the week with the same emotion which led Saint Jerome to say; “Sunday is the day of the resurrection, it is the day of Christians, it is our day.” For Christians, Sunday is the fundamental feast day, established not only to mark the succession of time but to reveal time's deeper meaning.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 1:00 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Thursday, December 17, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. Engaged couples preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage can register, explore possible dates or find out more information for pre-marriage classes by visiting **PhilaMarriagePrep.com**. REGISTRATION

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for reception of the Sacraments and letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist).
