REFLECTION on the GOSPEL

Call this "The Biography of a Failure:" Once upon a time there was a man who had less than three years of formal education and failed in business in '31; was defeated for the legislature in '32; again failed in business in '33; was elected to the legislature in '34; defeated for speaker in '38; defeated for elector in '40; defeated for Congress in '43; elected for Congress '46; and defeated in '48; defeated for Senate in '55; defeated for the Vice Presidential nomination in '56; defeated for the Senate in '58. His name? Abraham Lincoln.

That story highlights a component of something far beyond American political history in importance. Call it "persistence." I wish to promote that same quality has to be an important component of all our prayers. While it is essential, and stressed by Our Lord Jesus Himself, it remains most difficult to practice.

This is especially true for us as citizens of the so-called First World. Why? Because we are culturally surrounded by a veritable glut of "time saving" and mostly satisfying gadgets available even to toddlers. As a consequence, when we ask God for something in prayer, we want it delivered at least as fast as those gizmos deliver. Or as speedily as companies deliver them to our doorstep.

The Bible teaches us the contrary about God's schedule. He is never in a hurry. Consider just the time gap between the tragedy in Eden caused by Adam and Eve and the arrival of "the new Adam" in the womb of the Virgin Mary. Literally centuries long!

Today's Liturgy brings us to the Book of Genesis' presentation of an amazing dialogue between God and Abraham, "our father in faith" as the Roman Canon declares. With a boldness that even shocks us a bit, old Abe actually bargains with God for awhile! Persistence with more than a dash of "chutzpah."

Then, in Luke's gospel, just after Jesus gives the world the perfect prayer, He illustrates the importance of persistence in prayer with one of His inimitable stories.

So, on the one hand we have the example of entrepreneurs, whose persistence builds up a small company into a behemoth of business with amazing speed. And delivers products to us for near instant gratification. Contrast that with Jesus, the one person who is hopefully at the center of our lives, telling us to be patient, persevering and persistent in our prayer. Obviously, we recognize which one is the more important, both for our present and our future. We just need to be perceptive enough to know that we must keep practicing and never give up. After all, "By perseverance the snail reached the Ark."

God love you and give you His peace.

Even just ten minutes a day of heartfelt prayer by which we bring our thanks and needs to God and open our hearts to receive his wisdom and grace has a profound effect in our lives. Prayer keeps us centered on God so that we don't get caught up in the distractions and allurements of the world. We need God's grace and help if we are to love one another as he loves us. The Lord says, "Come to me." One important way of going to him is to converse with him in prayer. He always gives us what we need.

Saints Joachim and Anne: Grandparents of Jesus – Tuesday, July 26 is the feast day of Saints Joachim and Anne, the parents of Mary and the grandparents of Jesus. We extend our prayerful best wishes to all the grandparents in our midst. They play a very important role in our families. Their care, concern and helping hands bless our families and fill them with God's love and peace.

Saint Martha – Friday, July 29 is the feast of St. Martha. Although the Lord spoke to her some words of admonishment when she was so caught up and anxious about the things she had to do in serving him, she is a model for sanctity. She learned from the Lord and was a constant friend and support to him in his ministry. St. Martha inspires us to work lovingly for and with the Lord, to be his friend. His friendship is a source of great blessings for all of us, as it was for Martha.

CHURCH TEACHING

(*The Eucharistic Revival is a three year period of helping people to grow in their understanding and appreciation for the celebration of the Eucharist. The Revival has been called for by the bishops of the United States and began on June 19, the Solemnity of the Holy Body and Blood of Christ. As part of the effort to help you learn more about the Mass and participate more fully in it, I am including in the Bulletin each week a brief teaching on the Eucharist.*)

Church Teaching: The Eucharist as the New Passover – The Eucharist is a sacrificial meal, the sacred banquet of communion with the Lord's body and blood. Its fundamental pattern is found in the Jewish celebration of the Passover, which involves both a meal and a sacrifice. The Passover meal is celebrated in remembrance of the Exodus, when the Israelites were told to sacrifice a lamb to the Lord and to mark the doorposts of their houses with the blood, so that the angel of death would pass over their houses and leave the Israelites unharmed. This marked a people set apart and chosen by God as his special possession. Each family was then to eat the lamb with unleavened bread as a reminder of the haste with which the Israelites had to prepare for their departure from Egypt and with bitter herbs as a reminder of their deliverance from slavery. At the Last Supper, Jesus reveals himself to be the Paschal Lamb ("Behold the Lamb of God") whose sacrifice brings liberation from slavery to sin and whose blood marks out a people belonging to God. All the sacrifices in the Old Testament prefigure and find their perfect fulfillment in the one perfect sacrifice of Jesus.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. **The next Baptism Preparation Seminar is Thursday, August 18 2022, at 7:00pm in the Rectory.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. Engaged couples preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage can register, explore possible dates or find out more information for pre-marriage classes by visiting PhilaMarriagePrep.com. REGISTRATION

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for reception of the Sacraments and letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Please call the rectory for an appointment if you need a certificate.




