

REFLECTION on the GOSPEL

There is a strong dose of wisdom in those somewhat prosaic railroad crossing signs with the triple warning: "Stop; Look; and Listen." This can be readily applied to our spiritual lives, especially when it comes to the various sayings of Our Lord. First of all, "Stop." The sign makes it a command to traffic when it is soon to meet up with a high-speed train roaring at a road crossing. Not to obey is to court disaster.

For all of us striving to live as Jesus commands, there is a definite connection here with the usually frenetic pace of our everyday lives. The fact of our constant movement frequently coincides with a desire that everything get done quickly. We rarely ask ourselves why. So, for everything from the relief of our headache to the delivery of a refrigerator has to be speedily accomplished or else we become frustrated. Maybe even angry.

A session with Scripture has to be done in a generally relaxed and composed state, or we will not truly "hear" what Jesus is saying. That means stepping off our imaginary treadmill even if just for a quarter of an hour. Forget temporarily about your usual texting speed. That in itself can be the pause that refreshes. But only if it is a real pause. So we stop.

Our railroad sign reads "Look" and "Listen". Of course the command applies literally to our use of the Bible. It is a proven benefit to our psychic well-being as well as our prayer life to notice the world of wonders all around us. Wildflowers along a highway. Clouds drifting in a blue sky that form a pattern. A toddler's laughter. This not to omit the sight of senior citizens full of joy at a summer picnic. Sunrises and sunsets. The seashore or the mountains we might visit can speak to us of God and occasionally a prayer of the heart like few others. Conversations can convey more than the words we actually say to one another. We need to give our undivided attention especially when Our Lord says something like He does today: "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock."

We know that we can sometimes be a bundle of fears. Radically unable to heed that pertinent warning "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival." We have here both a warning and a formula for wise Christian living.

Lewis Sperry Chafer was an American theologian, who co-founded the Dallas Theological College with his brother Rollin. Here he provides us with some good advice for living, especially when there is no railroad crossing sign available. Yet he still has us thinking of trains. He referred to a friend who was devoting his time and energy in pursuit of an insignificant matter, and remarked, "He reminds me of a bulldog chasing a train: what's he going to do with it if he catches it?"

God love you and give you His peace.

From the Pastor

Evening Prayer and Adoration on Monday, August 15 – The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary will be celebrated on August 15. Because it falls on a Monday this year, it will not be a Holyday of Obligation. To honor Mary on this special feast, we will have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the Mary Garden, beginning at 7:00 pm. We will pray Evening Prayer and the rosary. Come and join us as we ask Mary to intercede for us so that we can be faithful disciples of our Lord.

Catholic Charities Appeal – The 2022 Appeal is still underway. Thus far, 112 donors from our parish have contributed a total of \$68,000 toward our goal of \$85,000. We are very grateful for their generous support of this important archdiocesan collection. The money collected through the Appeal supports the following: 57% goes to social services, such as feeding the hungry and helping the homeless; 13% aids education, especially for children with special needs; 11% helps the Archdiocese support evangelization efforts, as well as parish and spiritual life; 10% supports local missionary activities; and 9% provides for the needs of elderly and infirm clergy. If you have not yet made a donation, please consider supporting this Appeal, which is utilized to meet a variety of urgent needs here in the Archdiocese.

Feast of St. Lawrence, Deacon and Martyr, Wednesday, August 10 – Lawrence, a deacon in the early Church, suffered martyrdom in about the year 258. A Church was erected over the site of his tomb. The Church became one of the seven principal churches in Rome and a favorite place for pilgrimages. Lawrence served as a deacon under Pope St. Sixtus II. Although we do not know a great deal about his life, we know that as a deacon Lawrence helped manage the material goods of the Church and cared for the poor. Because of the great devotion to him soon after his death, his holiness must have been clearly evident to many people. He courageously gave his life for the faith, probably under the persecution of the emperor Valerian.

The feast of this early deacon is a good occasion for us to pray for Chris DeMaio, his wife Lauren, and all his family as Chris continues his studies for the permanent diaconate. We wish Chris all the best in his preparations for ordination as a deacon in a couple of years. May God bless him and may Chris be inspired by the example of the holy deacon, St. Lawrence.

Feast of St. Clare on Thursday, August 11 – St. Clare died in 1253. She lived in Assisi and was moved by the preaching of St. Francis of Assisi to devote her life to Christ. Against the wishes of her family, at 18 years of age she committed herself to living a religious life. Her sister, Agnes, soon joined her and others followed. They adhered to a strict rule of poverty, prayer and seclusion from the world. While St. Francis and his followers actively preached the gospel and served among the people, St. Clare and her Sisters supported the Franciscans and the Church with their powerful prayers and holiness of life. St. Clare was admired during her lifetime for her holiness of life and many came to consult her. Clare suffered with a serious illness for the last 27 years of her life. Her patience and goodness allowed her to unite her sufferings with those of Christ on the cross and helped to bring his redemptive power to the world. She never left the walls of her convent, San Damiano, but the prayers and holiness of her and her Sisters extended the saving grace of Christ to many people.

CHURCH TEACHING

The Eucharistic Revival is a three-year period of helping people to grow in their understanding of and appreciation for the celebration of the Eucharist. This Revival has been called for by the bishops of the United States and began on June 19, the Solemnity of the Holy Body and Blood of Christ. As part of this effort to help you learn more about the Mass and participate more fully in it, I am including in the Bulletin each week a brief teaching on the Eucharist from a document entitled "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church," which was prepared by the bishops to guide the Revival.

The Eucharist as a Participation in the Eternal Banquet – This great sacrament of the Eucharist is also a participation in the worship offered in heaven, in and through Christ, by the angels and saints. Pope Benedict XVI explained that "every Eucharistic celebration sacramentally accomplishes the eschatological (end times) gathering of the People of God. For us, the Eucharistic banquet is a real foretaste of the final banquet foretold by the prophets and described in the New Testament as the marriage-feast of the Lamb, to be celebrated in the joy of the communion of saints."

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.

COMMUNION CALLS

Parishioners unable to attend Mass regularly because of age or illness should call the Rectory to make arrangements to receive Communion at home. If any member of your family is hospitalized, please be sure to register as a Catholic and inform the Rectory so that a visit can be arranged.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the church laws), at least 16 years of age and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). 
