

BACKGROUND on the GOSPEL

In chapter 15 of Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells three parables about losing, finding, and rejoicing. The outcasts of society, the taxpayers, and the sinners approach Jesus eager to hear what he has to say. In Luke's Gospel, *hearing* is a sign of conversion. The Pharisees and scribes, still suspicious of Jesus, complain about him associating with sinners. So he tells them these three parables.

In the first story, the parable of The Lost Sheep, the shepherd leaves behind the 99 sheep to search for the 1 lost sheep. When he finds it, the shepherd rejoices not alone as in Matthew's version, but with friends and neighbors. In the same way, God rejoices more over 1 sinner who repents—like the outcasts who have come to hear Jesus—than over the 99 righteous like the Pharisees and scribes.

The second story, about a poor woman who will not stop searching until she finds her lost coin, makes the same point. Why are the Pharisees complaining? They should rejoice when the lost are found.

Finally we come to what is probably the most memorable parable in the Gospels, the story we know as The Prodigal Son. Just as in The Lost Sheep and The Lost Coin, this story (found only in Luke) is really about the seeker. The loving father is at the center of this parable. Even though his son runs off with his father's inheritance and squanders the money, the father waits for him, hoping for his return. Upon his son's return, the father, "full of compassion," runs out to embrace and forgive him before the son can utter one word of repentance. At this point the rejoicing begins.

The parable does not end there. Rather, it makes one more point about the older son's reaction. This son who never left, just like the Pharisees and scribes who feel they are righteous, refuses to enter his father's house to join in the rejoicing. He has served his father. He has obeyed him. Perhaps it was not out of love. The father's response teaches us that God's care and compassion extend to the righteous and sinner alike. When we are lost, God doesn't wait for our return. He actively seeks us out. And when the lost are found, how could we not celebrate and rejoice?

From the Pastor

Welcome to Sister Mary Ann Clarahan, RSM – I am happy to announce that Sister Mary Ann has been hired as our Coordinator of Parish Services. It is a part-time position of 24 hours per week. Sister will help in a variety of areas in the life of the Parish, especially with Adult Faith Formation, Service Opportunities, and Youth Ministry. Sister has a doctorate in Sacred Liturgy from the Pontifical Institute of Liturgy in Rome. She has taught in a variety of settings throughout her ministry as a Sister of Mercy. Sister began working with us on September 1. We are very glad to have her as part of our Parish and look forward to her presence here.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults – Our R.C.I.A. classes will begin on Tuesday evening, September 20 at 7:00 pm in the rectory. These classes are for adults interested in learning more about the Catholic faith with a view possibly to being baptized or received into the Catholic faith, and for baptized Catholics still in need of the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. Also, for those who might not be able to meet on Tuesdays, other arrangements can be made for times of instruction and formation in the faith.

Summer Enhancements – We were able to make several improvements to our facilities this Summer. The old organ was removed and the new organ has been installed. It sounds wonderful and we are looking forward to it helping to make our liturgies even more beautiful and inspiring. The cost was about \$74,000. For several years we have been pointing part of the walls of the Church. The north side of the Church was completed this year at a cost of about \$12,000. The only part that remains to be done is the high tower. The rectory porch was repaired and painted for about \$8,000. New flooring was laid in several classrooms in School. This completed a three-year project of replacing the carpets in the classrooms with durable tile flooring. The floors look great and are much easier to clean and keep sanitary. Many thanks to our maintenance staff, especially Gerry DiGiovanni, for laying the new flooring. These improvements were possible because of your generosity and support.

Thank you for Your Support of the Missions – Many thanks for your kind support of the missions in response to the appeal from Sister Lilia of the Little Sisters of St. Francis. The collection amounted to \$2,392. Your generosity will do much good for the many needy people served by the missions.

Adult Faith Formation Session on the Litany of Trust – Sister Faustina, a member of the Sisters of Life, has written a beautiful prayer, The Litany of Trust, to increase our trust in God's loving care for us. Sister has also written a book based on her Litany. We are blessed that Sister will be at our Parish on Thursday, September 22, to speak on the topic of joyful trust in God. Dinner will be served at 6:00 pm, followed by Sister's presentation at 7:00pm. Come and join us for this grace-filled opportunity of overcoming fear and increasing our trust in God. Adult Faith Formation with the Catechism – In the Spring of this year, we made available to the Parish fifty copies of the Catechism of the Catholic Church and invited you to read Section IV on Christian Prayer. This Fall we are going to provide another fifty copies of the Catechism and invite you to read Section III on Life in Christ (Christian Morality). This section is a long one, so you can concentrate on reading Chapters one and two of the Section and then continue further if you wish. The Catechism is broken up into a couple of pages to read each day. We invite you to begin the readings on October 1, or even before that if you so desire. We will have a Gathering on Wednesday, October 26 at 7:00 pm in the Antioch Annex for any people who want to discuss the readings. Reading the Catechism is a great way to get a fuller understanding of our Catholic faith.

Knights of Columbus Meeting – The meeting will be on Tuesday, September 13 at 7:00 pm in the Antioch Annex.

Pre-Baptism Class – The next class will be held on Wednesday, September 14 at 7:00 pm In the rectory. Parents who are having their first child baptized are asked to attend one of the classes, which are held once a month.

Opening of School and Back-to-School Night – Our School opened on Monday, August 29 and got off to a really good start. It was a delight to see our returning students again and to welcome our new students. Special thanks to our maintenance staff - Gerry DiGiovanni, Ralph Holzer, and Bob Monroe for having the School so clean and ready to go. Our teachers, staff and principal worked hard this Summer to get everything ready and all their preparations made for a great beginning to our 100th Anniversary Year for St. Margaret School. This Thursday, September 15 is Back-to-School Night for our parents and guardians. They will meet the teachers of their children and hear about all the plans for this year.

CHURCH TEACHING

The Eucharistic Revival is a three-year period of helping people to grow in their understanding of and appreciation for the celebration of the Eucharist. This Revival has been called for by the bishops of the United States and began on June 19, the Solemnity of the Holy Body and Blood of Christ. As part of this effort to help you learn more about the Mass and participate more fully in it, I am including in the Bulletin each week a brief teaching on the Eucharist from a document entitled “The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church,” which was prepared by the bishops to guide the Revival.

Church Teaching: Communion with Christ and the Church – When we receive Holy Communion, Christ is giving himself to us. He comes to us in all humility, as he came to us in the Incarnation, so that we may receive him and become one with him. Christ gives himself to us so that we may continue the pilgrim path toward life with him in the fullness of the Kingdom of God. The fourteenth-century Orthodox theologian Nicholas Cabasilas described this sacrament by saying, “unlike any other sacrament, the mystery of the Eucharist is so perfect that it brings us to the heights of every good thing: here is the ultimate goal of every human desire, because here we attain God and God joins himself to us in the most perfect union.” Through this sacrament, the pilgrim Church is nourished, deepening her communion with the Triune God and consequently that of her members with one another.

REGISTRATION

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays afternoons. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 12. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE


